# Path blazed for two-year, loan-free college degree

The Sheboygan Area School District (SASD), Lakeshore Technical College (LTC), and Lakeland University (LU) are leading the nation with the first program that will allow high school students to earn an associate degree at their high school and complete a bachelor's degree in just two years following graduation.

College Here & Now, an innovative public-private partnership, was unveiled on Monday, Oct. 29, at Sheboygan North High School.

By taking dual-credit courses, SASD high school students can earn an LTC associate de-

gree in Information Technology (IT) – Web and Software Developer at the same place and the same time they complete their high school diploma. Through the partnership, the associate degree will be offered with no tuition cost to students and their families.

Students can then continue their education to earn a Lakeland bachelor's degree in computer science in just two years following graduation. If those students participate in Lakeland's Cooperative Education program, they can earn scholarship money and wages to graduate with little or no tuition debt.

While College Here & Now will debut in the fall of 2019 as a pathway to gain entry into the computer science and information technology fields, future pathways under discussion by the three institutions include majors in business, healthcare and education.

LTC and Lakeland classes will be offered at North and South High Schools in dedicated classrooms which the higher education institutions will also use to offer other college coursework. "College Here & Now expands and enhances learning opportunities and experiences for students, which in turn, will ensure our students are highly qualified and have the skill sets needed for success in our competitive world," said Sheboygan Area School District Superintendent Seth Harvatine. "Having two classrooms at both North and South High School for LTC and Lakeland removes the time and transportation barriers for students seeking to take college-level classes."

Paul Carlsen, president of Lakeshore Technical College, noted that while College Here & Now is a win for the entire Sheboygan community, it is most importantly a win for students. "College Here & Now is a commitment to provide a college education to every student in the Sheboygan Area School District, including students who never thought college was for them, but take college courses because of this partnership. College is not hundreds of miles away and only attainable through crippling student loan debt," Carlsen remarked.

College Here & Now creates a new workforce for local employers fueled by a student-centered approach by SASD, LTC and Lakeland.

Lakeland President David Black said the university's co-op program is a perfect match for College Here & Now. "By working together, we are eliminating the barriers that prevent many students from earning a college degree," Black said. "At

the same time, we're providing human capital for the many great employers in this region, especially in areas where they have high needs. We are excited to continue working with SASD and LTC to expand College Here & Now to more academic areas so we can reach more students."

The program includes a full set of courses starting a student's freshman year, and continuing each year until graduation.

However, students can enroll in the program at any time and take advantage of the various college courses offered on campus. Information will be provided to students starting in eighth grade as they begin planning their high school coursework. # Airport customs center stays on radar

SHEBOYGAN – Another attempt to ground the proposed customs facility at the Sheboygan County Memorial Airport failed to take off Tuesday.

The County Board turned down an effort to delete funding for the \$6 million facility at their meeting Tuesday.

Sheboygan Falls resident and airport user Jay Hoogstra was the only speaker at the public hearing on the proposed 2019 county budget and he called on the board to pull

the plug on the facility that is part of the county's five-year capital plan.

After Hoogstra's comments, Supervisor Brian Hoffmann moved to suspend the board's rule to allow another vote on including the center in the five-year spending plan, approved earlier by the board.

That would have required a two-thirds approval, but the motion to suspend the rules got only 13 votes in favor and seven against, with five supervisors absent.

Hoogstra, as he has in the past, continued to call the customs facility unnecessary and

a waste of money.

He said the county could "save a lot of money" by arranging for a temporary customs facility during major events like the 2020 Ryder Cup golf tournament.

"But customs does not like to do temporary, they prefer brick and mortar," Hoogstra said of federal customs facility, then pointing out that temporary facilities are used at other airports in the state.

He continued to question the need for and projected income from such facility.

Hoogstra cited the county's previous support for the failed

Morgan Aircraft facility at the airport, which was intended to build a hybrid helicopter/airplane.

"You got bad information when Morgan Aircraft said they were coming to town,"

Hoogstra told the supervisors. "Most of the pilots at the airport told you that wasn't going to work. I'm telling you you might be getting bad information now," about the customs facility.

Stew that was in my column last week. Everyone enjoyed the healthy stew which we had with fresh Italian bread, cottage cheese and pasta salad and pumpkin pie for dessert.

**Note:** Although the recipe below comes with directions to cook the corned beef brisket in the oven – if you own one, I would make it in a pressure cooker, which will ensure that it will be done and tender. If you decide to use a pressure cooker, cook the brisket for about an hour. Put about 2 cups of water in the bottom of the pan. Stop and cool down pressure cooker to add vegetables about a half hour before serving. When using a pressure cooker, I make potatoes separately.

 **New England Boiled Dinner**  
*Makes 6 servings*

- 4 to 5 pounds unspiced, corned beef brisket
- Water to cover
- 6 peppercorns
- 4 whole cloves
- 1 clove garlic
- 1 bay leaf
- 12 small whole carrots (or more)
- 6 small to medium potatoes, peeled and cut in pieces
- 6 small whole onions, peeled
- 1 medium head of cabbage
- Paprika

Rinse brisket well; place in large Dutch oven with close fitting cover. Add cold water as needed to cover meat. Add peppercorns, cloves, garlic and bay leaf. Cover; bring to simmering stage and simmer gently until tender, about three and one-half hours. Do not let water gallop. Thirty minutes before end of cooking time, add carrots, potatoes and onions. Cut cabbage into six wedges. Eight to ten minutes before end of cooking time, add cabbage wedges.

Remove vegetables; drain. Drain corned beef; arrange on heated platter and sprinkle top with paprika.

Slice corned beef across the grain and arrange vegetables and brisket on serving platter.

 **Venison Swiss Steak**  
*Makes 6 servings*

- 2 lbs. round venison steak
- Flour
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- Cooking oil
- 2 onions, sliced
- 2 ribs celery, diced
- 1 cup carrots, diced
- 2 cups fresh or stewed tomatoes
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce

Combine flour, salt and pepper. Dredge steak in flour mixture. Brown in oil in skillet. Place in slow cooker. Add remaining ingredients. Cover and cook on low heat 7-1/2 to 8-1/2 hours.

 **Easy Barbecued Venison**  
*Makes 6 to 8 servings*

- 2 to 3 lb. venison, or beef roast, cubed
  - 2- large onions, sliced in rings
  - 1 to 2 (18 ounce) bottles barbecue sauce
- Put layers of meat and layer of onion rings in slow cooker. Drizzle generously with barbecue sauce. Repeat layers until meat and onion rings are all in place.

Cover and cook on low heat in slow cooker for 8 to 10 hours.

Eat with au gratin potatoes and a vegetable, or slice thin and pile onto steak rolls, drizzled with juice.

**Note:** To be sure venison cooks tender, marinate overnight in 1 cup vinegar and 2 tablespoons dried rosemary. In

the morning, discard marinade, cut venison into cubes, and proceed with recipe.

The original building dates back almost one hundred years. There were many additions since then, as well as a variety of owners and names. Probably the best remembered are “Happy & Kelly’s” and “Uncle Otto’s.”

New owner/operator James Clary opened Rumors in August of this year. He made some changes and one feels a friendly ambience upon entering the Old World Style Pub complete with fireplace. To the left is a game room with “machines” and a pool table—convenient but far enough away so as not to irritate bar patrons with the “machines” clicking away or noise from pool table competitors.

Further back is a dance hall with four alluring, gossamer, sparkly curtains and a mirrored glass ball that revolves and casts fleeting reflections of starlight that bounces off swirling dancers. (Maybe I’m a tad overly dramatic but I’ll betcha you’ll have fun dancing in this atmosphere.)

The dining room is to the right of the bar. There’s a dozen or so tables so when the room is filled it’s difficult to converse even with the folks at the same table—seems all the talking goes straight up and bounces back down from the ceiling. (Many restaurants have these same acoustical problems.)

The menu is quite large although the second time we stopped

some of the items had been crossed off. Any menu in a new restaurant is always evolving and subject to customers’ preferences.

First time we went with friends George and Geri. None of us had planned to have pizza. But some other folks we knew were already gnawing on pizza and just raved and raved about how good it was. Obviously all four of us ordered pizza. Carol and I had the Rumors Deluxe Edition thin crust 12-inch size (\$15—16-inch is \$19). George and Geri had Charcoal Chicken Pizza (thin crust, twelve inch). Yes, our other friends were absolutely correct. It was the best pizza we had ever had. Now, let’s hope Rumors can maintain that same quality.

Second time we went back was with our other good friends Ted and Bev. We resolved to try some of the other menu choices. Had an appetizer called Rumor’s Lake Side Moons @ \$7.99. The quantity served was huge and more than enough for all four of us—in fact we didn’t even eat it all. The menu described it as “delicate deep fried sliced potatoes with colby jack cheese, bacon crumbles and scallions with creamy dill sauce.” It was all of that—the dill sauce was served in a separate container for dipping. The potatoes were really a thick cut potato chip and the cheese was melted and poured over it, then topped with the bacon and scallions. Looked pretty, and it was good, but it was a bit difficult to maneuver a chip and some cheese topping and bacon and onions. As it cooled off it all got a little lumpy. Despite all that we did manage to chow down most of it.

We also had a Chicken Tenders appetizer (\$6.99)—good but nothing unique. They were good size and not like the itty-bitty nuggets one usually gets. They offered a choice of sauces

for dipping.

For his main meal Ted (a very cautious eater) had the Baked Cod (\$11.99) and he was well satisfied. His wife Bev wasn’t too hungry so she kept working on the Rumors Lake Moon appetizer.

Carol and I shared the Lake Perch (\$12.99) which was lightly breaded (looked like Panko breading to me) and pan fried. It came with coleslaw, marbled bread and a choice of potatoes. For a change we skipped the usual french fries and the potato pancake and got the Au Gratin. It came like a large slice of cake with a melted cheese topping—all ok but packed a little too tight. I would order this perch plate again but I’d choose french fries or maybe the potato pancake.

Sandwiches range from \$8.99 to \$12.99 and hamburgers are between \$8.99 and \$13.99 all served with their home made chips. Eat the chips and you’ll never order french fries again.

Sunday brunch (9 a.m. to 4 p.m.) features a Lake Side Omelet @ \$8.99 or how about the Sunday Hangover @ \$12.99, which is a meatloaf sandwich topped with an egg and hollandaise sauce and a side of chippers. They also have Eggs Benedict, Crepes, Scotch Eggs, Roasted Smokey Ham or a beer basted charcoal Chicken Dinner.

Maybe we’ll see you some Sunday?!

**Seniors take on loan debt of their children**

The outstanding student loan debt in America has increased to over \$1.3 trillion. Of this debt, seniors owe \$67 billion and, on average, each senior who has student loan debt owes \$23,500. Seniors used the bulk of the loans to pay for children's or grandchildren's education.

Under most circumstances, borrowers cannot erase student loan debt under bankruptcy protection. Moreover, the federal government can garnish Social Security payments to cover federally backed student loan payments. This forces seniors to survive on a small portion of monthly benefit checks and cut back on other expenses, such as medical and food costs.

However, some borrowers may qualify to have their federal student loans forgiven. Borrowers who are considered totally and permanently disabled (TPD) may be eligible to have their federal student loans forgiven.

This includes:

Veterans who the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has determined are unemployable due to a service-connected disability;

Borrowers receiving Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) or Supplemental Security

Income (SSI) benefits; and

Borrowers certified as "totally and permanently disabled" by a physician.

Each option has different requirements for the supporting documentation that a borrower must submit to the Department of Education with the borrower's TPD discharge application. Additionally, some private student lenders also offer disability discharge options for borrowers with disabilities. Lenders that offer these programs may use guidelines that differ from the Department of Education to determine eligibility.

There used to be a catch-22 when borrowers had their student loans forgiven. The Internal Revenue Service treated any amount a borrower had forgiven as income. As a result, student loan forgiveness was taxable in many situations. This meant that if a borrower had \$40,000 forgiven, their taxable income would be increased by \$40,000.

Fortunately, recent changes in the federal tax law may prevent some borrowers from having to pay federal income taxes on the student loan debt that was

# Chemical spill drill exposes alert weakness

At each of the three schools in Sheboygan Falls, teachers who are normally teaching a lesson were recently learning one.

Last week's Shelter in Place safety drill was a first for Sheboygan Falls schools.

"We had completed a table top exercise, but never run an actual drill of this nature," said Sheboygan Falls School District Administrator Jean Born. "It was a learning experience."

The drill was a chance to make sure teachers and staff are prepared for a potential chemical or biological scenario.

In meeting with the county's Emergency Management Director, Steve Steinhardt, the district learned about the potential for a crisis involving a hazardous material spill, such as anhydrous ammonia, which is used as a refrigerant at numerous food manufacturing facilities and is transported in bulk by tanker trucks on our highways.

"While the district drills regularly for natural disasters such as tornadoes and other bad weather, they had not drilled for something equally likely to happen in our county," said Steinhardt. "It was great to work with the district's safety team to plan a drill. And taking part in training at teacher inservice in August helped me

realize that this district is committed to keeping students safe in any type of crisis."

The hazardous material spill scenario which Steinhardt created for the district involved a semi trailer accident at the State 28 and State 32 roundabout.

The anhydrous ammonium spill had proximity to the high school, but also potential to impact to the elementary and middle school campus due to the prevailing winds.

Steinhardt was able to connect the district's safety team with the county's Rescue Task Force, Hazmat Team, and local law enforcement and fire department to help them better understand the potential consequences involved in the scenario.

"During our table top exercise, our team did a great deal around planning the communication in the event of a Shelter in Place scenario," stated Sheboygan Falls School District Director of Instruction Mary Lofy Blahnik, who coordinates the district's safety team. "We were surprised to learn that the county does not have a system to contact the neighbors surrounding the school. We are fortunate, however, that we do have a messaging system for our families who have students enrolled in our district. Com-

munication becomes a crucial component in managing any crisis situation."

Blahnik and the safety team came up with a protocol that could possibly be used to have a message ready for students to text to their parents in the event that they had missed a message from the school district.

"The main reason we test our plans is to identify what we do well, and more importantly, where we can improve," Blahnik said. "Communication almost always comes up as an area to improve. Sheboygan

County lacks the ability to reach out and notify the public in an emergency.

"I would like to see our local officials make a reverse 911 system a priority in a future budget cycle," she said. "The ability to share information in a timely fashion can be the key to a successful response to an emergency and I think our public is under the assumption we can do it. Unfortunately, we don't have a mass notification system in place at this time."

"I thought the plans were pretty well in place," Sheboy-

gan Falls Elementary School Principal Lynn Bub shared.

Bub had added to her school's scenario in order to practice a preventive lock down in addition to a Shelter in Place.

This caused the teachers to think on their feet, and they were able to problem solve how to transition between the two safety protocols.

"We had a few missteps, but I think it helped prepare us because now we know some mistakes that we made as a district," said Born. "The debrief that was held using staff input helped us update our safety protocols."

# Forgiven debt no longer boosts borrower's income

**LOAN** from 6  
 Borrowers whose student loans are forgiven on or after Jan. 1, 2018 due to "death or total and permanent disability," are no longer required to

pay federal income taxes on those forgiven loans. Now, when the Department of Education or a private lender forgives a student loan due to a borrower's death or disability, the amount of forgiven debt no longer counts as income and

does not cause a borrower's federal taxes to go up. Before this change, some borrowers with disabilities or those unable to work faced financial distress driven by a tax bill because they qualified for debt relief. If you have any additional

**Medicare Advantage - Part 1**

The Medicare Prescription Drug, Improvement and Modernization Act of 2003 created Medicare Advantage (Part C) as an alternative to traditional Medicare and Medicare Supplement. The Act allows private insurance companies to offer medical plans that combine Part A, B and Prescription Drug (D) into one medical benefit plan.

Advantage plans are annual contracts that begin January 1 and end December 31<sup>st</sup> of each year and either renew for the following year or end. They are regulated by Medicare and must follow strict Medicare guidelines, but within these guidelines insurance providers have opportunities to offer different levels of medical and prescription drug benefits. Current monthly costs range from \$0 per month to \$292 per month in Sheboygan County.

Traditional Medicare Supplement plans are costly and increase in cost over time and it is difficult to move from one Supplement plan to another without going through underwriting. The average cost of traditional Supplement, with all riders is dependent on age and Zip Code. For Sheboygan County the general costs ranges are:

The current cost for a benefit rich Advantage plan with prescription drug is \$292 for all age groups and there is only one underwriting question for Advantage plans; do you have End Stage Renal Disease?

Medicare Supplements plans are regulated by the State of Wisconsin; Advantage plans are regulated by Medicare. Supplement Plans offer additional Wisconsin Mandated Benefits that Advantage plans do not, but Advantage plans may offer additional benefits that Supplements do not. **So what is the best plan for you?** It all depends on your current health, prescription drug needs, and financial situation. 

# Oh give us a home where the winged wonders roam

The Parade never ends, you just don't know. I thought by this time I would be watching deer and taking pictures of some nice bucks. They'll have to wait.

It seems every time Annie and I go out looking for birds, we find something in the way of a nice picture or unusual bird. Some examples:

1. We saw this Bald Eagle on our way to visit our good friend Bill, who is in assisted living in Fond



du Lac. Going through St. Cloud, we saw this Bald Eagle sitting in a tree, looking down. We pulled over and got a picture. It looked like she was going to take off. I aimed the camera to get a nice flying shot, placing her

in the bottom left of the frame. All ready for the perfect shot. Instead of taking off, she dropped straight down into the river and caught a fish for supper. No picture! I should of realized she was sitting in a tree along the river bank.

2. Annie and I were dropping off a copy of The Plymouth Review Current for friend Marion, who

lives on the river at Collins. She loves our articles in The PRC. As Annie talked birds with her, a pair of Bald Eagles landed in her tree. The women stayed under the porch, out of the rain, but I didn't mind getting wet to get some good pictures.

3. While heading to our monthly Plymouth Bird Club meeting, we had some time to kill. We went

to a good birding spot near Plymouth. (Thanks, Bob Brigham.) I believe Annie got our best pictures ever of a female Belted Kingfisher at Bob's spot.

4. We'd just left a roadside garden stand with the best sweet corn, zucchini, squashes and pumpkins, where Annie loaded up with all these goodies. Not far out of the driveway, I said, "There sits a Great Horned Owl." It was still early afternoon. When you find a Great Horned Owl, to avoid scar-



ing it off, you usually have to drive past them a long ways, then turn around and drive past again. We turned around at the garden stand driveway. Annie got the camera ready. With no cars coming, I rolled down the window. Annie handed me the camera. We found the owl again. Unlike most Great Horned Owls, this one stuck around. We got some great pictures.





## Veterans Memorial continues to stir emotions

**I**T HAS STOOD AS a silent, but powerful and stirring, tribute for nearly a quarter of a century.

Last month, in what has become a solemn annual ritual, 74 more names were added to the Sheboygan County Veterans Memorial on Wilgus Avenue in Sheboygan.

That's the greatest number of veterans' names added to the memorial in any one year in its history, which made this year's ceremony even more significant and memorable.

The Sheboygan County Veterans Memorial was built in 1994, with seven slabs of granite inscribed with the names of county residents who died in action on one side and the names of those who served on the other.

Those memorials have long since been filled with names requested by grateful loved ones and family members of those who served, leading the committee which oversees the memorial to add two additional walls filled with more names of those who have served.

While the memorial is visible to traffic passing on Sheboygan's busy Kohler Memorial Drive, it is located next to picturesque Taylor Park and situated to provide quiet solitude for visitors to reflect on and pay their respects to all the veterans whose names are inscribed on the granite walls.

Allen Nohl, chairman of the Veterans Memorial Committee, in his annual report to the County Board this week, said the number of names added to the wall made this year's ceremony especially

significant.

Next year will bring an even more significant event for the memorial, as it will celebrate its 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary next August.

Nohl said a weekend-long celebration is scheduled for Aug. 23-25 next year, similar to the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration held four years ago.

Planning is already underway, with tentative scheduled events including a brat

fry, a World War I living display and a visit from a Vietnam War-era American Huey 369 helicopter, including a chance to ride in the helicopter. There will be more events and activities as well.

The Sheboygan County Veterans Memorial is an impressive, inspiring and fitting memorial, one which gives due and proper recognition to those who served and sacrificed.

What it stands for, what it represents and what it recognizes should never be forgotten.

The center stone of the memorial is inscribed with a quotation from President Franklin D. Roosevelt: "Those who have long enjoyed such privileges as we enjoy forget in time that men have to win them."

That should never happen. The Sheboygan County Veterans Memorial helps ensure that it will not.

It is a fitting and reverential tribute to those who have served and sacrificed, well worth a quiet, reflective visit to pay tribute and homage to all of those listed upon it.



# Accordion keys are his stairway to heaven

"If you want real German music, I'm your man"

As musical instruments go, the accordion is a bit of an anomaly.

While its unique design and whimsical musical tone is familiar to most, the accordion is an instrument that is commonly misunderstood and often misrepresented in modern culture.

Just ask longtime accordionist and master musician Dennis Smith of Sheboygan Falls, who has been a devotee of the musical art of the accordion for the better part of the last 66 years.

As one of only a handful of accordion players and instructors in the Sheboygan County area, Smith has dedicated himself to cultivating an appreciation for the instrument that it rightfully deserves.

"I've been playing the accordion since the age of 4 in April 1952," Smith said. "I kind of came upon it by accident, but I have stuck with it ever since. It has been a big part of my life even to this day.

"It is an often misunderstood instrument because most people only associate it with polkas or waltzes and kind of in a funny or even cheesy kind of way," he said. "There is so much more to the accordion than that. It is actually a classical instrument that has played a key role in many of the greatest classical music pieces of all time. I spend a lot of time educating people about the accordion and its sig-

nificance as a music instrument. It has been something I've really enjoyed doing for all these years."

Raised in a musical family in the Englewood, Calif. area, Smith first picked up the accordion shortly after his sister, Karen Carmody, started playing the instrument.

"My sister broke her arm riding a horse and she needed to do something to build up strength in that arm," Smith said. "My father, who was a vaudeville musician, suggested that she start playing the accordion as exercise to get her left

arm back into shape. After she started playing, I got interested and also began to play.

"We both still play the accordion and when we get together, we even play together from time to time," he said. "We have an amazing connection through the accordion that is hard to explain. Even if we haven't seen each other for a long time and without practicing together or anything, we can start playing a song together and it just flows beautifully."

# Multi-tasking instrument runs rings around polkas

It didn't take long for Smith to dive deeply into the accordion, as well as several other musical instruments, including the clarinet and saxophone, at a young age.

By the age of 10, he entered his first accordion competition in California, which he continued to do on a regular basis through the age of 15.

After staying highly active in music through high school and college, Smith earned a music education degree from Cal State Northridge.

However, Smith's career path led him in a different direction as he opted to become a certified public accountant, after earning an accounting de-

gree at Woodbury University in Burbank, Calif.

Smith's CPA career led him to Milwaukee where he served as the chief internal auditor for the city of Milwaukee for 20 years.

Throughout his 30-year career as an accountant, Smith continued to be involved in music performing with several German dance groups in and around the Milwaukee area.

"Even though my professional career was in accounting, I always made time for music," Smith said. "I started playing for a German group at the age of 18 in 1967 and I have performed that style of music ever since. I just love doing it."

"While I have performed solo and as a member of Bavar-

ian, Austrian and Mardi Gras groups for over 50 years now, I would say German music is my specialty," he said. "If someone wants to find a performer that does German music, I'm definitely your guy."

Smith says longtime readers of The Sheboygan Falls News may recall that his wedding to his wife, Pam, was prominently featured in the paper during the week of Sept. 5, 1981.

"We had an authentic German wedding in costume at what was then called St. Mary's Church in Sheboygan Falls, which is now Blessed Trinity Parish," Smith said. "Our reception was held at the Waelderhaus in Kohler. We had seven German dance groups perform at the wedding."

"My wife, Pam, was born and raised Sheboygan Falls and she graduated from Sheboygan Falls High School in 1949," he said. "Pam's family heritage dates back to the 1820s in Sheboygan County, so those German ancestral roots run pretty deep in this area. The wedding was a pretty big deal because not many people go all out to do a German-themed wedding like we did, even back then. I still remember the full-page article on our wedding that ran in The Sheboygan Falls News."

After retiring from his CPA position in Milwaukee, Smith moved to Sheboygan Falls in November 2011 into the house Pam had grown up in on School Street across from the former Sheboygan Falls Middle School.

"Moving to Sheboygan Falls has been great for us and it has helped me to build my name as a musician in this area," Smith

said. "I get more calls now to play my accordion than I ever did in Milwaukee. It is a lot of fun."

In addition to performing nearly every week, Smith also gives accordion lessons to a handful of students.

"I have four regular accordion students that I am currently working with," Smith said. "Teaching the accordion, as well as voice and woodwind instruments is something I really enjoy doing. I would love to add a few more students and do even more teaching in the future."

Smith would like nothing more than to champion the virtues of the accordion to a new generation of musicians in Sheboygan County.

"The accordion was basically killed off as a major classical instrument in the 1950s and 1960s," Smith said. "It became known only as an instrument for polkas or waltzes, but there is so much more to it as a classical instrument that I want people to know about."

"I'm starting to see things turn around now for the accordion," he said. "I have a lot of friends that are classical accordionists and it is great to see young people get involved in playing this great instrument. The classical pieces written for the accordion are really amazing works. The Russian and German composers wrote for accordion quite often and I always encourage people to check out those great pieces."

Smith describes the accordion as one of the most difficult instruments to learn.

"The accordion is really three instruments in one, so it is

really very challenging to learn how to play well," Smith said. "You have the piano keyboard, the bass notes and the button box that produces basic chords like the ones that are played on a guitar. Then you also have at the bellows that are always moving to create different sounds."

"There is so much going on when you are playing an accordion," he said. "There are basically four things going on at once, which can be challenge, but also very satisfying when you learn how to do it."

Smith is a longstanding member of the Sheboygan Accordion Club, which includes 30 members of varying ages and skill levels.

"We meet once a month at Pine Haven and play occasional concerts as well," Smith said. "We also raise money for music scholarships that we award to local music students each year."

In addition, Smith enjoys making appearances at local schools to properly introduce the accordion to the younger crowd.

"I like going to high schools and teaching kids about the accordion," Smith said. "I stress that the accordion is about more than polkas and waltzes. I typically play all different types of music on the accordion for the kids, such as 'The William Tell Overture,' 'Hallelujah' by Leonard Cohen and a John Denver song or two. The kids usually get a big kick out of that. They are normally surprised that an accordion can be played that way."

In addition to performing

Donors of all blood types, especially type O, are needed this fall after Hurricanes Michael and Florence forced the cancellation of about 200 blood drives, causing approximately 7,000 units of blood and platelets to go uncollected.

### How to donate blood

Simply download the American Red Cross Blood Donor App, visit RedCrossBlood.org or call 1-800-REDCROSS (1-800-733-2767) to make an appointment or for more information. All blood types are needed to ensure a reliable supply for patients. A blood donor card or driver's license or two other forms of identification are required at check-in. Individuals who are 17 years of age in most states (16 with parental

consent where allowed by state law), weigh at least 110 pounds and are in generally good health may be eligible to donate blood. High school students and other donors 18 years of age and younger also have to meet certain height and weight requirements.

Blood and platelet donors can save time at their next donation by using RapidPass® to complete their pre-donation reading and health history questionnaire online, on the day of their donation, before arriving at the blood drive. To get started, follow the instructions at RedCrossBlood.org/

RapidPass or use the Blood Donor App.





“Brace for impact,” advised a gray-bearded man wearing wire-rimmed glasses. Shaggy, dark brown curls tumbled out from beneath his tawny, felted hat, and the hundreds of mycologists in the audience could feel his excitement. “And can someone turn out the lights?” he continued as the slide on the screen revealed the phrase “Bio-diversity is Bios-ecurity” against a luminous blue background.

Paul Stamets is a visionary, award-winning mycologist (person who studies mushrooms), author of “Mycelium Running – How Mushrooms Can Help Save the World,” (2005) and founder of Fungi Perfecti, a company that grows and sells mushroom products for “Home and Garden, Field and Forest, People and Planet.” He believes that mushrooms, and the network of root-like fungal mycelium that produces them, can heal the planet (including humans.)

as Paul reflected on the similarities between systems of brain neurons, galaxies, dark matter, the internet, and fungal hyphae. What do they all have in common? Redundancy in their information pathways. If one route is broken, several alternatives can carry the data. “I calculated that every footstep I take impacts more than 300 miles of mycelium,” he shared. All that mycelium in a small place means many opportunities for connection and re-connection. Humans would do well to imitate the resiliency of those networks, Paul suggests.

Fungi, Paul argues, are both the internet and the immune system of the Earth. Mycorrhizal fungi, who form partnerships with the roots of most plants, extend their root-like hyphae throughout the forest floor. As I described with black trumpet and hedgehog mushrooms a few weeks ago, the fungus grows a layer of hyphae around the tree’s tiny roots, and even in between the cells of the roots. Then, the fungi stretches its network of hyphae out into the soil, and aids the tree in acquiring water and nutrients, especially nitrogen. Mushrooms, as they decompose, also cycle quite a bit of phosphorus in a forest ecosystem.

The mycelia not only benefit their main entists shaded a Douglas fir tree, the fungi brought it sugars from a nearby birch. This is just one way that mushrooms can sup-



port the health of a forest.

The mycorrhizal fungi that partner with plant roots occupy a pretty unique niche in the forest. They often grow with just one or two types of trees. Many are choice edible and medicinal mushrooms (like my hedgehogs and black trumpets), but they are almost impossible to cultivate because of their specificity.

Saprophytic mushrooms, on the other hand, decompose organic material, and are absolutely critical to renewal in the forest. They turn dead stuff into healthy soil with plenty of nutrients for new life. Some saprobes can even decompose things like petroleum and fecal bacteria. They can act as living filters for pollution. And many edible species can be grown fairly easily in your basement or backyard.

Most of the audience already knows this. As members of the North American Mycological Association (NAMA) attending the Annual Foray, they've been seeking choice edibles and comparing notes on cultivating mushrooms all weekend, in addition to collectively picking and identifying over 364 species from the surrounding area.

Paul's talk was not new to them, since he is a regular at their gatherings. I, in contrast, had only heard vaguely of his ideas, and had let his book drift to bottom of my reading list. His excitement for the subject sparked mine.

Hopefully, we'll know even more in the years ahead about how mushrooms can help save the world.
