Middle school rebuilding at Urban site gains traction

After a community survey and feedback at community engagement sessions showed a lack of support for the Sheboygan Area School District's proposal to construct a new Urban Middle School at a new site at Najacht and Mill Roads, the administration has presented and the Board of Education has offered informal approval to pursue a new plan to rebuild the school at its current site.

"We have been talking internally about options to rebuild on the existing Urban site right from the beginning of the community engagement sessions," Matthew Wolfert of Bray Architects told the board at its June meeting. "We think this is an extremely viable site and building plan that will support teaching and learning for decades to come."

Wolfert said his firm plans to work with the school administration and have a proposed board resolution ready in July, prior to putting the matter before voters at a November referendum.

"I am deeply grateful that we have pivoted to reflect community concerns," commented school board member Mary Lynn Donahue. "The pivot we have made is heart-

warming. It's not something we usually see in large government processes."

The new proposal would preserve the historic character of Urban's façade, address concerns about traffic congestion and limited parking and avoid displacing students, according to Wolfert. It would involve about three years of construction in three different phases.

More than 50 community members attended and six spoke at the meeting. There were also large turnouts and many comments opposing the original plan at previous informational sessions, where residents expressed concerns about traffic safety, distance away from the main student population and potential impacts on residential neighborhoods and wildlife.

Two speakers at the June board meeting cited declining student enrollment as reasons why the district should be conservative about spending on additional school building.

Alan Jante of Sheboygan said he had done research showing that over eight years, the student population has declined by 941 students, or almost 10%.

He urged the board to look more closely at population trends.

Wolfert said that the cost of the new Urban rebuild would be between \$117 and \$122 million, or at least \$4 million less than the original plan.

Bill Foster of School Perceptions, the firm which conducted the community survey, told the board that 3,315 people responded and nearly half of those lived in the Urban Middle School enrollment area, even though it included the attendance areas for all three of Sheboygan's middle schools and addressed the proposed rebuilding of Farnsworth Middle School on its current site also, which drew stronger support.

Overall, the survey indicated that "if held today, a \$126 million referendum to fund the building plan would be too close to call.

Residents in the Urban Middle School attendance area were less supportive of the proposed plan than respondents living in the Farnsworth or Horace Mann attendance areas," Foster said.

Wolfert assured the board and audience that rebuilding Urban on site could be accomplished safely, with physical barriers in between students and construction zones.

Background Checks would be conducted on all construction workers, he said.

30-year dispatcher could have written the book on close calls

After 30 years as Telecommunications Officer at the Sheboygan County Communications Center, Amy Schwarz has moved on.

"I loved what I did. I loved the job," she said. "There obviously were good things and bad things, ups and downs, and things that kind of stick with you forever. I wish I would have started a journal about the types of calls that we took in the course of the day.

"I probably could have written a book." It would have included stories about the major flood in Sheboygan in 1998, when 10.8 inches of rain fell.

"I just remember people calling in and saying my basement is flooded. The water is rising," Schwarz said. "But it's like, 'yeah, I'm sorry, but so are a lot of others.' I don't recall if the fire department responded to - I don't think they responded to all of them. Conceivably they couldn't."

The best chapter in the book likely would have been on several of her life-saving stories.

Before the Emergency Medical Dispatch existed, Schwarz sometimes would have to give CPR instructions over the phone. Once a woman called about her husband, whose lips had already turned blue after he stopped breathing.

Thanks to Schwarz, he survived. "The best part about that was that I got to meet the family," she said. "They came in and we talked, we hugged. There's nothing better than meeting somebody that you left a mark on."

Not everybody makes it, however. A babysitter called and Schwarz instructed the person how to give CPR to the infant. It worked, but several days later the child died.

"Those are heartbreaking," Schwarz said. "People ask you all the time, what is the worst call you ever took? My response to them is you don't want to know. You don't want to know what the worst call is."

Schwarz started dispatching for the county in March of 1994. Initially, she applied to work in the jail when it was suggested she pursue the dispatch position. Back then, part of the test was on a cassette tape and she had to do a number of other tasks while listening to it.

Schwarz was so impressive, she was offered the job.

One country, One destiny

IN MY VIEW

U.S. Representative Andy Kim

In the aftermath of the attempted assassination July 13 of former President Donald Trump, The Beacon wholeheartedly endorses the sentiments of Congressman Andy Kim (D-NJ), posted on X (formerly Twitter) and reprinted below.

“When Lincoln was shot he wore a coat embroidered with ‘One Country, One Destiny.’ I’ve turned to those 4 words to help me process this moment. This assassination attempt was one of the worst events I’ve seen in our democracy. It feels like we are a country unmoored.

“I’ve never experienced a time more unpredictable yet with such generational consequence. So what does this particular moment mean? I remembered a passage in a book I read. ‘Power and violence are opposites; where the one rules absolutely, the other is absent.’ [Hannah Arendt, *On Violence*, 1970]

CALLS from 2

But it wasn’t easy at first.

“There was one point I didn’t know if I was going to make it, you know, if I was going to catch on,” Schwarz said. “And my trainer was getting frustrated. I was getting frustrated. And one morning I woke up, and it just clicked. And it’s history. The rest is history. I discovered that is what I was meant to do in life. ... And I like to think I was pretty good at it. Otherwise I wouldn’t have stayed in it for 30 years.”

Schwarz recalls having to refer to paper maps that hung on the walls in her early days.

Her final days were much easier because of technology.

“Your computer tells you exactly everything you need to know,” Schwarz said. “It tells you who to send, gives you the crossroads. Sometimes, if they call 911 on an Apple or an Android phone, they have information in their phone like emergency contacts. We have access to all that information. If they’ve got medical stuff on their Android or iPhone, we have access to that.”

Schwarz, who even got to train with the FBI as a Crisis Negotiator in 2015, ended up winning four Awards of Excellence, three Commendation Awards and two Life Saving Awards.

Her last official day was about two months ago.

“It was time for me to go. You get to that point,” Schwarz said.

“The deep unease we carry is in part the fact that we witnessed with the shooter one person trying to use the means of violence to impose their will upon a nation of 330 million and subvert the power of people that underlies our very democracy.

“And now trepidation across our nation as ‘The practice of violence, like all action, changes the world, but the most probable change is to a more violent world.’ We fear retaliation, reprisal or escalation. But let us remind ourselves that it doesn’t have to be that way.

“In the aftermath of other recent shocks to our country, we failed to unify and instead sadly grew more divided. I had hoped that these shocks would be what I called defibrillator moments that would shock our irregular heart beats into normal rhythm, but we fell far short.

“It’s not just that our divisions have grown so wide in our country, but our willingness to allow contempt to accompany us. It’s not just a disrespect that we see towards one another, it’s a deeper disregard and a disgust of one another.

“We are losing touch with the understanding that we are all part of something bigger than all of us. As those 4 words of Lincoln - One Country, One Destiny - remind us, the commonality we share runs deep and cannot be forgotten or dismissed.

“Violence is cowardice not strength. It is fiercely undemocratic. As we process this shock, we can choose to realize that we’ve gone too far as a society down the path of contempt. We are not each other’s enemy. We are not at war with each other.

“Choosing to unite instead of incite does not mean we dismiss the magnitude of our differences. But it compels us to be cautious and precise about our next steps, our words, and our actions in this unbelievably precarious moment.

“One Country, One Destiny doesn’t mean we all agree, but instead reminds us that we share the same fate. We collectively mourn the death of the rally attendee [Corey Comperatore], we are relieved that Trump wasn’t seriously injured. Now let’s unite around Lincoln’s vision One Country, One Destiny.”

As You See It

Homelessness

To The Editor:
The Society of St. Vincent de Paul expresses concern regarding the U.S. Supreme Court’s decision in *City of Grants Pass, Oregon v. Johnson*.

By ruling in favor of the plaintiff, the Supreme Court has signaled that local governments can make it a crime for someone to live outside and unsheltered if they have no home.

Reasonable people may and will disagree about this decision, but the fact of the matter is it doesn’t get to the heart of the homelessness crisis.

Neither stricter nor more lenient criminal laws sufficiently address the problem — which has vastly more to do with skyrocketing housing costs and inflation than it has to do with how local governments regulate homeless encampments.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul maintains a national network for homeless prevention through rent assistance with an outlay of over \$60 million. These programs typically involve home visits, personalized resources, engagement with landlords, crafting a “Stability Plan,” and financial assistance in making rent and paying utilities.

These programs usually work alongside local governments, putting homelessness prevention ahead of policing in addressing the roots of homelessness.

These temporary assistance programs work — and produce long-lasting effects while reducing the economic and social strain of homelessness on cities, towns, and counties. But more than dollars, homelessness prevention programs like ours save lives and dignity.

While City of Grants Pass, Oregon v. Johnson helps call attention to the severity of our homelessness crisis, we must work together to restore stability and dignity to neighbors living on the edge of homelessness.

According to a recent study conducted by Notre Dame’s Lab for Economic Opportunities, persons who received an average of \$2,000 in emergency financial assistance were “81 per cent less likely to become homeless within six months of enrollment and 73 per cent less likely within 12 months.”

In the wake of the Supreme Court’s decision, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul will continue unabated to pursue positive outcomes like these across the country.

Alien aquatic plant search planned

Sheboygan County Planning & Conservation Department invites nature-lovers of all ages to Snapshot Day, a search for aquatic invasive species (AIS) on August 10th, 2024 at Maywood Environmental Park. Snapshot Day is a statewide effort to protect Wisconsin's streams, lakes, and wetlands by monitoring designated sites for invasive plants and animals that may threaten the state's wildlife and water ecosystems.

This year is Snapshot Day's 11th anniversary, coordinated in partnership by UW-Madison Division of Extension, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR), and the Citizen Lake Monitoring Network. Information collected during the event will provide the Wisconsin DNR with data to help them tailor response efforts accordingly for each site. Volunteer efforts are crucial to the success of this endeavor.

More and more people want to know how they can help protect the local lakes, rivers and streams they love. "Gathering samples of invasive species on Snapshot Day is a great way to give the Wisconsin DNR a heads up on invasives that may have recently arrived at particular lakes and rivers. With this information, gathered by volunteers like me all across the state, the DNR can hopefully get out in front of the problem and reduce their impact—I think that's very important," says Dawn Nelesen, Snapshot Day 2023 volunteer.

In Sheboygan County, we are dedicated to improving water quality. We have multiple programs and partnerships including a 9-Key Element Plan for the Pigeon River Watershed, buffer strip and cover crop programs, and others that benefit water quality. We maintain public access areas at 6 lakes in the county, and aquatic invasive species are potential threats to their unrestricted use. We believe that volunteers are an invaluable tool for monitoring for these potentially harmful species and we look forward to working with volunteers, new and returning!

This will be the 8th time the Sheboygan County Planning & Conservation Department hosts Snapshot Day, working alongside over 20 other conservation organizations to prevent the spread of invasive species across Wisconsin.

He's been in MMA for about 4-5 years and trains at Roufusport, under the direction of coach Nate Jennerman.

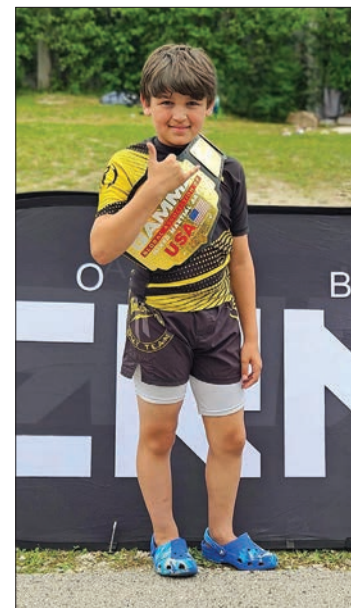
"It's really good exercise, it's fun, it makes me more confidence in myself and also gives me more protection," Clayborn said. "It makes me feel like I can do this and I can do that."

"We never had the opportunity to host it in this part of the state before, so we made a bid to them and a couple of their board members came to one of our other shoots," WBC outdoor range manager Mike Mrdjenovich said. "We talked, and they came back and looked at our facility, looked at the property, and so we put our name in the hat with others."

"They really liked this area, plus they hadn't been in this part of the state before to hold it - that was another plus - so we were awarded the shoot."

Camping opens the Friday before the tourney begins, and registration for the shoot is at 7:30 a.m. that Saturday. Also that day is a Sasquatch 50/50 Novelty Shoot.

On Sunday, the top shooters in each division - based on age - continue on to determine who has the most points.

"We hold several outdoor shoots a year, but this one is specifically just for traditional people," Mrdjenovich said. "So all we know is from other clubs. People come from all over the state. We know there's a gentleman coming from outside of Rochester, Minn. There

"It's kind of a big deal. If you're a traditional archer, anybody that shoots traditional

archery is probably aware of there's a state shoot, but we want to make them aware that it's in this area, come and patronize local businesses, you know, enjoy it here for a weekend. Some of them camp, some of them stay in town. It's like any other event, where some

Traditional archery is a recurve bow or a longbow. There's no mechanicals, no sights, no releases, according to Mrdjenovich, who says it's like what fly fishing would be to regular fishing.

"You know, kind of a purist," he said. "Some of them make their own arrows. Others make their own bows. So it's, I don't want to say primitive, because

obviously there's some technology involved nowadays with it, but it's recurves and longbows."

There are 30 different 3D foam animal targets on the 40-acre wooded course that are shot from the ground or towers to challenge one's ability to be able to put an arrow where it's supposed to be.

"It's just a lot of fun. It's not a serious, serious event," Mrdjenovich said.

"These people are great people that love to have fun and meet other people that like what they like."

Whitetail Bowhunters was founded in 1962 and has members of all ages and skill level.

It holds shoots, events and tournaments for the public along with summer and winter leagues.

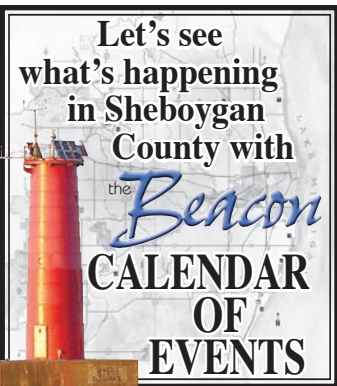

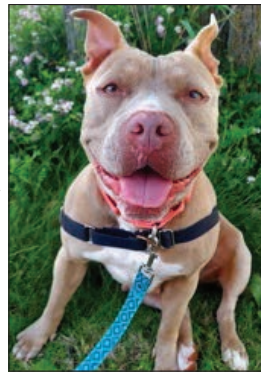

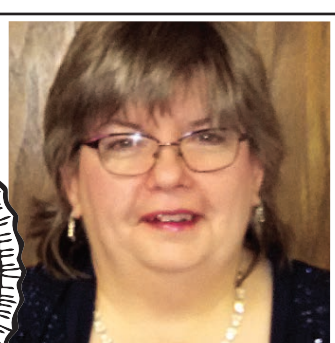

Family picnics, bonfires, fireworks, food, friends, etc. Whether you celebrate quietly or with a group, food is usually something given a little extra effort when it's a holiday. We will be spending the day at home, but plan to fry out and I decided to make homemade-Brioche buns for the occasion. They are soft and yet sturdy

enough to hold a burger and the fixings. We tried them for lunch and they are wonderful.

By the time this hit press the 4th will be in the past. I am hoping that everyone has a safe holiday and can use this recipe to spark some extra compliments at your next grilling occasion.

Summer just seems to be going way too fast, due to it not being hot and feeling like summer. We just got back from a trip to Nebraska and South Dakota. While it was wonderful seeing the sights, I still believe we live in the safest, most beautiful

part of the country. God Bless America.

Note #1: I mixed the 6-c. flour into the dough with the mixer. I also kneaded an extra cup in by hand due to the severe stickiness of the dough. It is still supposed to be sticky- but workable.

Note #2: I divided the dough into 12 pieces about 4 1/2 oz. each- this seemed a good size for hamburgers or steak sandwiches.

Note #3: I used Tuxedo sesame seeds (black and white)

Note #4: Although it always takes time to make yeast dough- this is a VERY simple recipe that anyone can follow!

Milk Brioche Buns

Pour into a mixer bowl:
2 c. warm milk

Add:
1 pkg. quick rise yeast
1/2 c. brown sugar

Stir, cover with a cloth and let stand 15 min.

Add:
1/3 c. oil
1 T. white vinegar
1 t. salt
2 large eggs.

Mix and slowly stir in:
6 c. all- purpose flour*

Stir in:
3 T. +1 t. softened butter

Dough will be very sticky. *
Place dough in bowl and cover let stand 2 hours.
Divide dough into 9 balls*
Arrange on baking sheet lined with parchment paper.
Cover with cloth and leave for 30 min.
Preheat oven to 350°.
Mix together;
1 egg yolk
1 T. milk

Coat briochees with egg mixture and sprinkle with sesame seeds. *
Bake 350° for 20 min. or until lightly brown on top and bottom. Cool.

Sweet potatoes add substance to potato salad



When warm temperatures arrive, few people want to spend extra hours in the kitchen whipping up elaborate meals. Many would rather be outside enjoying the great weather. ones that make delicious potato salads. Change the flavor profile and even the nutritional benefits with this sweet potato version.

Sweet and Savory Sweet Potato Salad Makes 6 servings

- 4 cups cubed, peeled, cooked sweet potatoes (about 4 to 6)
- 3/4 cup chopped green onions
- 1/2 cup chopped fresh parsley
- 1/2 cup dried tart cherries
- 1/4 cup plus 2 tablespoons rice wine vinegar
- 2 tablespoons coarse mustard
- 1 tablespoon extra virgin olive oil
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper

1. Combine sweet potatoes, green onions, parsley, and cherries in a large bowl; gently mix.
2. Whisk vinegar, mustard, oil, garlic, salt, and pepper in a small bowl until well blended.

Pour over sweet potato mixture; gently toss to coat. Serve immediately or cover and refrigerate until ready to serve.

Note: You can cook the sweet potatoes in boiling water or in the oven.

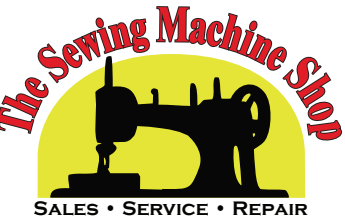



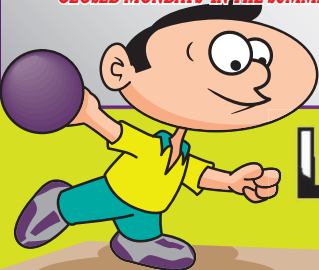
