On occasion, we are asked if law enforcement is a tough profession. My general answer is yes, there are a lot of sacrifices that the men and women of our agency make for the betterment of the community. BUT it's a lot easier when we have a supportive community that stands with us!

I recently put a challenge out to our staff asking if they would help contribute to an established supply drive that would benefit the community of Asheville and the Asheville Police Department. Our employees asked that it be shared on our Facebook page so it could be shared with their friends and family. The challenge was to raise enough to force me to rent a U-Haul to transport the supplies to De Pere. We quickly grew past that!

The community and business support are truly amazing.

Sargento donated a truck, trailer, and driver to take the donations to Antigo where they will be transferred to Karl's Trucking Company. The semi was full.

Professional Supply donated their receiving area to load the semi along with donating half a trailer of supplies. They donated approximately 16 skids of cleaning supplies, gloves, hand sanitizer, sanitizing, and disinfectant wipes totaling over \$60,000.

Rockline Industries donated 2 pallets of disinfectant wipes,

over 1,800 containers.

Old Wisconsin donated 3 pallets of food totaling almost 3000 pounds of product.

Wal-Mart on Vanguard Drive for their sizeable donation of water.

Employees, friends, and family of the Sheriff's Office donated countless pallets of requested supplies.

Employees from the entire county pitched in from our Human Resources Department, Maintenance to the Highway Department.

Kohler Company employees stopped by with several vehicles loaded with supplies.

Members of the community stopped by in droves. Church groups, scouts, and general caring members of the community.

Supplies that were provided were bottled water/gallon jugs of water, Paper Towels, Toilet Paper, Diapers/Baby Wipes, Trash Bags, non-perishable snack items, blankets and towels, Toiletries, etc.

This started Tuesday evening with an email to our employees explaining that the Police Lights of Christmas was partnering with Karl's Transportation to send supplies down to North Carolina. It was asked of them to donate what they could by Friday and we would transport

the items to De Pere to support their mission and our fellow Americans. On Wednesday afternoon I was asked to put a message on Facebook so it could be shared with Friends and Family. Come Thursday morning the word was out and the community support was starting to trickle in. By early morning I was trying to find a U-Haul. By early afternoon one of our Sergeants was trying to find a semi!

In an economic time where budgets are tighter and margins are more narrow, our community members and businesses stretched themselves to help our fellow Americans in need. We will likely never meet the recipients of these donations, but it will make a lasting impact on them and their families.

So is this profession difficult, you bet! But these are the times that make me incredibly proud to live in and serve Sheboygan County, knowing at the end of the day, our community members will rise to the challenge and stand with us in helping our fellow citizens!

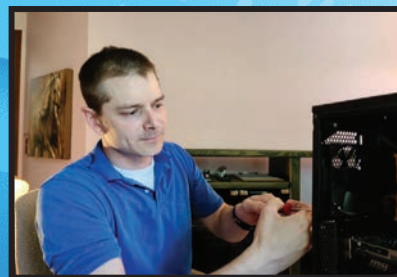

Firefighters go face to face with students

by Sheboygan Fire Dept.

The Sheboygan Fire Department has a proud history providing a robust fire prevention program to our community's children through grade-level based, face-to-face engagement with members of the department. In 2023, the SFD provided school safety programs to more than 3,000 students and the department participated in more than 100 public events including the Citizens Fire Academy. This is a reputation our department has maintained a special focus on since the 1960's. As it stands today, the department provides the following grade level based lessons to students in both public, private, and home school groups:

Kindergarten - The Friendly Firefighter program is an interactive program that involves a firefighter in full protective gear that exposes the children to a firefighter with a different look. This allows them to understand that,

while the firefighter may look different, they are there to help them.

First Grade - The Stop, Drop, and Roll program is designed to develop a self-protection skill for the children should their clothing catch on fire. The behavior of fire is discussed, and an interactive segment of the program gives the children an opportunity to

practice the stop, drop, and roll technique while wearing a special vest with flames that come off when they roll on the carpeting.

Second Grade - The Plan to Escape program is designed to develop skills related to planning for escape from a home or other location that is or may become dangerous. We will have activities that

should be taken home and completed with a parent or other responsible adult.

Third Grade - The House of Hazards program is an interactive, visual representation of a typical home with many of the common home fire hazards. Lessons are taught to the students about recognizing and avoiding potential hazardous situations in the home. This is done through a model home with electronically controlled effects to illustrate to the students firsthand the potential outcomes of various common situations in the home.

Fourth Grade - The Survive Alive program is a culmina-

tion of the lessons learned in the previous four programs offered by the Sheboygan Fire Department. It involves the use of a full-size simulated house on wheels. Students will review lessons related to smoke detectors, escape plans, household hazards, dialing 911, etc. Using theatrical smoke, the students are introduced to rapid escape and decision making in a hazardous situation.

Throughout the decades the content of the SFD's school safety programs has been adjusted to reflect present day fire hazards and technology.

Spend a night without shelter at Taylor Park

A Night Without Shelter is an event to build a deeper understanding of the challenges associated with homelessness and an opportunity to spend the night outside. This event will occur on November 2-3 at Taylor Park, 3104 Erie Avenue, Sheboygan. Registration will start at 5:30 p.m., with the event beginning at 7:00 p.m.

The earlier part of the evening will include presentations and conversations around the experiences of

Sheboygan County's unsheltered population. Participants are welcome to join for solely the presentation portion of the night; however, we encourage attendees to consider staying overnight.

Those staying overnight are welcome to use vehicles or tents, or simply sleep completely unsheltered. At this time we are NOT allowing recreational vehicles. The goals are to educate, help the community understand the perspectives of those experi-

encing homelessness, reduce stigma, and build empathy.

Making it through Milton --a first-hand account

Sally Bork has dealt with hurricanes before.

However, none where the eye of the storm went directly over Sarasota like Milton did on Wednesday.

"As a kid, we had some that they call near-misses, where we got some of the bands from the rain and wind, but not serious wind," the Sheboygan resident said. "Wednesday was serious wind."

Milton made a direct hit on Siesta Key, located less than 10 miles south from where Bork grew up in Sarasota.

She moved to Wisconsin to attend Lakeland - her father went there - and she stayed in the area after meeting her husband in college.

Bork works for the Boys Scouts and oversees several counties, including Sheboygan,

and has two daughters who attend middle school in Howards Grove.

But Bork's father was scheduled to have heart valve replacement surgery on Wednesday, so she flew down the Friday before to help prep the house.

At the time, Milton wasn't even a hurricane.

"So we were watching the news and they were saying it's going to hit the Gulf Coast," Bork said. "I grew up in Florida and we've had a lot of near misses when it comes to hurricanes. They tend to scoot around our area. So we were watching it, watching it, and it started as a Category 5. And then I'm watching our local weathermen compared to the national weather. And they're like, it's going to die down a little bit because of the wind shear

down from Georgia. And I was like, OK, OK.

"So we were trying to make the decision. Do we get the house ready and then evacuate? if we do that, where do we go or do we just stay?"

Last Tuesday, one day after her father's surgery was can-

celled, they decided to stay in the house - located less than a mile-and-a-half from the ocean.

"And part of that was because the gas stations were running out of gas," she said. "You didn't want to get stuck on the highway with no gas. ... So leading up to the storm was by far the worst, because once you make the decision to stay - I'm a mom, and my kids are up in Wisconsin - you get all those feelings like, oh, did I make the right decision? Am I going to see them again? All those things."

"And so once the storm finally hit, it was like, 'okay, we've done everything we can. Hold on.'"

Bork has heard all about how the eye of a hurricane is calm, and now she has proof.

"You would think that the storm had passed," she said. "We walked out of the house and it wasn't raining, it wasn't blowing. It was that way probably a half-hour, 45 minutes, and then

the wind started to kick back up and we went right back into the house."

The back half of the storm was far stronger than the first half, according to Bork, which made things a little more nerve-wracking because she could hear the wind howling and whipping more.

But other than losing power - it returned the following day - as well as a couple of shingles and some big limbs off a tree in the backyard, the damage was minimal.

"It depended on which way the winds were blowing, but most of the houses in the neighborhood all really withstood the wind well," Bork said.

And on Thursday, normal Florida weather had returned.

"It's really bizarre because it is like a beautiful, sunshiny, you wouldn't think anything happened kind of day," Bork said. "Blue skies and a nice sea breeze. It is crazy."

Hit and run suspect arrested

The suspect of a hit-and-run that severely injured a bicyclist Oct. 6 was arrested last week after Sheboygan police put out multiple messages asking for the public's help in identifying the vehicle believed to be involved.

The Sheboygan Police Department first reported that on Sunday Oct. 6 they responded to the intersection of S. 8th and Spring Ave. at 5:30 a.m. to find a bicyclist laying in the roadway who had sustained significant injuries. The victim was later reported to be in critical condition at Froedtert Hospital as of Thursday, Oct. 10.

The department posted security-camera-style videos to their Facebook page showing a white

vehicle passing by, saying that "officers are working around the clock to identify the driver and vehicle," and asking for the public's help with identification.

Police subsequently posted a photo of the 2001 white Lincoln Continental they believed to be the suspect vehicle, which was finally located by the next day in Milwaukee.

The suspect, a 41-year-old male from Fredonia, was also located and arrested and taken to the Sheboygan County Detention Center for a probation violation. A charge of hit and run causing great bodily harm was referred to the District Attorney's office. The suspect was not named. The Ozaukee County Sheriff's Department assisted with the arrest.

North coach BJ LeRoy is also going to miss her.

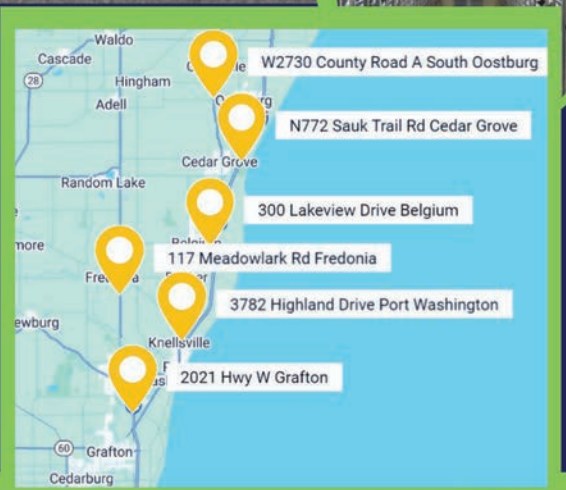

Locals take 'most epic' hunting trip

Dan Francis and his best friend share the same birthday.

It happened to be Louie Gentine's 50th, however, so just any hunting trip wouldn't suffice.

The two - Francis runs Francis Chiropractic and Gentine is the CEO of Sargento - have already hunted for elk in New Mexico and buffalo in Nebraska.

And Francis has hunted bear in Canada and red stag in New Zealand before, so he had to plan bigger and better.

"This was the most epic of the trips, though," he said.

That's because the pair, along with Travis Trepanier (Gentine's cousin), flew to Anchorage to then catch a bush plane that flew them two hours away to stay in an area somewhat adjacent to Denali National Park for a guided hunting trip in mid-September.

"So when we landed, there were like six guys playing rock-paper-scissors to see who was going to make it onto the plane to leave because there wasn't enough seats," Francis said.

Maybe having to sleep in a tent for so long has that effect.

"They put up a little bear fence, an electrical bear fence, charged by a battery so the bear won't come and get your food inside the tent," Francis said. "It's wild because there's a lot of bear

around there, grizzly and black."

Gentine ended up with a "really nice" bull moose, according to Francis, and he also shot a grizzly bear later in the trip.

Trepanier nabbed what their guide and packer of their camp called the widest bull of the year.

And Francis shot a big, heavy rack, wide-paddled bull moose as well.

"They were absolutely massive," he said. "Louie shot his not too far from camp. Travis was a mile, mile-and-a-half, but

it was flat tundra. I shot mine a couple miles from camp, and it was elevation, brush, rivers together.

"It was three hours hiking with some of the meat on your back and then your backpack. And then we had to go back the next day and get another load. So it's a rigorous hunt."

An eye-opening one, too.

"It's wild, because I was not allowed to shoot moose that you would gag over," Francis said. "I mean, there was moose that was four-and-a-half feet wide, and the guide would say, 'nope, that's not big enough. They won't let me come back here if I let you shoot that.'"

"So there were moose that I would have loved to have shot,

and I had to pass them up. I'm like, 'oh, this is killing me. It looks huge to me.'"

The meat was transported by a special plane back to Anchorage, and then trucked to Portage for the men to soon pick up.

"There's going to be over 600 pounds of meat from each moose," Francis said.

The trip wasn't perfect, however.

There were a few days spent in Anchorage waiting for the weather to get better to fly on the puddle-jumper.

Wet clothes were pretty much all that remained toward the end of the hunt as well.

But Francis doesn't hesitate when he says he would do it all over again.

"It was so exhilarating," he said. "And no cell service. So you're really just in the moment. You're getting to know these guides, you're learning about how they hunt, why they hunt."

"I sort of set the hunt up, so when Louie first got a bull, that took pressure off because when you set it up, you want to make sure the guys get something. Then when Travis got a bull, that was great.

Enjoy dining out while minding calories

Dining out can provide a welcome respite from cooking at home and presents a great opportunity to socialize while enjoying a delicious meal.

Diners concerned about over-indulging on nights out should know those concerns are not necessarily unfounded, as a 2016 study published in the Journal of the American Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics found that 92 percent of meals from large-chain and local restaurants contain more calories than is recommended for the average person.

The study found that the average restaurant meal contained 1,205 calories, which is a little

less than half the United States Department of Agriculture's recommended daily calorie intake for men between the ages of 36 and 40 and more than half the recommended daily intake for women in the same age group.

The sizable portions restaurants provide need not be seen as a deterrent to dining out. Rather, diners should instead remind themselves to eat only a portion of their entrée when dining out. Leftovers can then be wrapped and taken home.

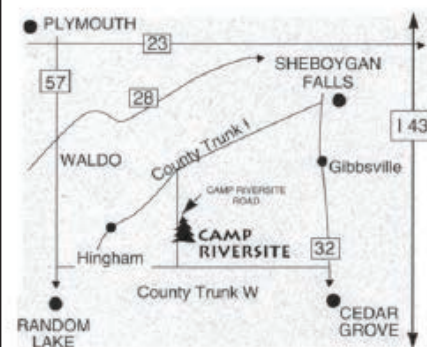

Hearing Loss: The Hidden Strain on Your Body and Brain

Last week, we had a Lunch & Learn event here at our office, and the visiting audiologist, Christine Boyer from leading hearing aid manufacturer Oticon, listed all the ways that hearing loss effects our physical bodies and health, saying "Hearing Health Care is Whole Health Care."

1. Strain on the Auditory System
The most direct physical effect of hearing loss is the strain it places on the auditory system. The ear is responsible for converting sound waves into electrical signals that are interpreted by the brain. When hearing diminishes, the ears and brain must work harder to process sounds, leading to auditory fatigue. This added strain can result in a significant decline in the ability to distinguish sounds, especially in noisy environments. 4. Social and Emotional Stress
Although not always recognized as a "physical" symptom, the emotional stress caused by hearing loss often manifests physically, even triggering a flight or fight response in some individuals. Struggling to hear conversations can lead to feelings of frustration, anxiety, and embarrassment. These emotional responses provoke physical reactions, such as increased heart rate, muscle tension, and fatigue. Over time, this chronic stress can take a toll on the body, contributing to higher blood pressure and a weakened immune system.

5. Impact on Cardiovascular Health
Hearing loss may also be associated with cardiovascular health. Research has suggested that poor circulation can impact the blood flow to the inner ear, potentially contributing to hearing loss. Conversely, hearing impairment may serve as an early indicator of cardiovascular problems, as the small blood vessels in the ear are often among the first to show signs of reduced blood flow. Additionally, the stress and frustration related to hearing loss can increase the risk of hypertension and heart disease.

SAFETY TIPS FOR TRICK-OR-TREATING

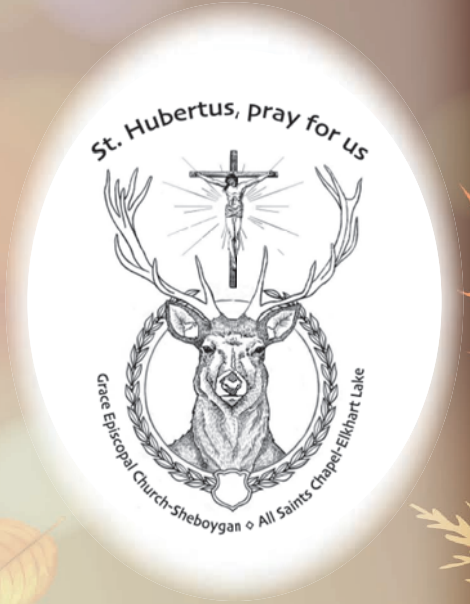

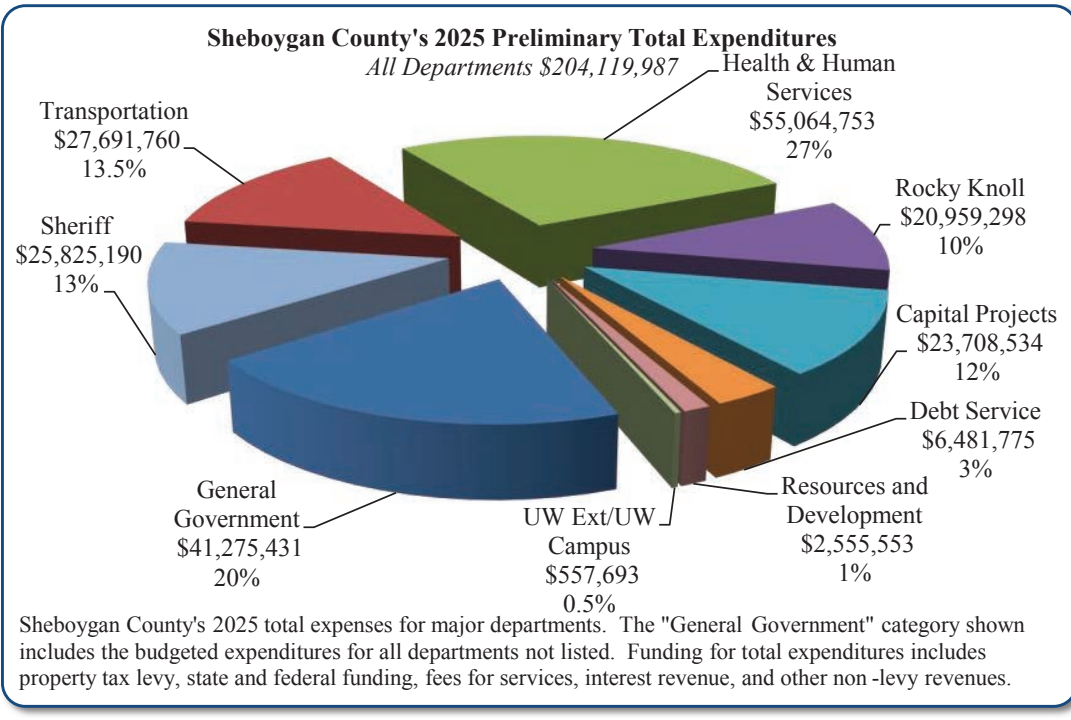

PROPOSED COUNTY BUDGET RELEASED – Sheboygan County released its proposed budget for 2025. The proposed property tax rate is \$3.58, a decrease of 7.93%. The 2025 budget reflects the 9th consecutive year the property tax rate has gone down. In addition to the property tax levy, the budget primarily consists of federal, state, sales tax, and user fee revenue. The annual budget supports 19 departments and 875 employees implementing over 200 programs and services. A public hearing on the proposed 2025 budget will be held on Oct. 29, with final approval of the budget on Nov. 5. All County Board and Committee meetings are open to the public.

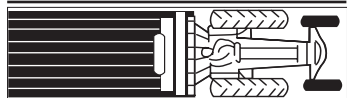
