Revisiting some of Sheboygan County's most shocking crimes

One of Sheboygan County's strangest mysteries of all time involved poisoning with strychnine, which was once commonly used for pest control.

Katie Dippel Reilly, lead researcher for the Sheboygan County Historical Research Center, described this and other notorious crimes of the 1800s and early 1900s at the latest presentation in the popular History on the Move series, held

November 12 at Generations in Plymouth.

The Plymouth Post of December 31, 1910 reported that Mr. and Mrs. **Enos Eastman, Jr.** had returned home after watching a basketball game at Plymouth's Turner Hall and found a box of candy addressed to daughter, Sarah, on their front steps. They presumed it was a gift from friends, sampled some, were alarmed by a bitter taste and summoned a doctor - who quickly determined it was laced with strychnine. The East-

mans got sick within minutes and remained ill for a week, but recovered.

"That evening, boxes of the same candy were also delivered to the William Holling and J.E. Curtis homes," Reilly said, quoting from her mother's research. "It was later found that every piece was laced with the poison. No notes were left. The only handwriting was the recipient's name. The bottoms of the chocolate drops had been cut off and replaced after the strychnine was mixed with the filling... Many of the candy pieces contained enough poison to kill several people."

Evidence was scant, but police soon zeroed in on 28-year-old Louis Brickner, a local man with handwriting similar to that on the candy labels, who was an odd duck and "fancied himself a ladies' man," according to Reilly. Thanks to a strong alibi and skilled attorney, he was exonerated, but no other suspect was ever charged. More than two decades later, Brickner was struck by a train and lost both

legs below the knee.

Sometimes county residents travelled westward seeking fortune, adventure or improved health, but never lived to return.

That is just what happened to young Sheboygan barber **John Leicht**, who left for Arizona in 1907 in the hope that the dry climate would improve his asthma and severe allergies. On the train bound for Phoenix, he met a man named **Louis Eyttinge** and they rented a room together, then went out in the desert for a picnic the Sunday morning after their arrival.

Around 11:30 that morning, Eyttinge returned to town without Leicht and offered conflicting excuses for his acquaintance's absence, then fled. Eight days later, a rancher found Leicht's body, and it was clear that he had been robbed and murdered. Eyttinge was convicted and while in the Arizona Penitentiary, he set up a mail-order business for goods produced by convict labor and became a successful author and sales-letter writer who would

later return to prison for swindling and forgery.

In the early 1900s, Francis Boggs and his wife Mary Hosmer were leading actors on the stage at White City Amusement Park, which was part of Lake View Park on Sheboygan's south side.

But at the age of 38, while also working as a local manager of the Selig Polyscope Company in Los Angeles and in a business meeting with its head, Boggs was shot and killed by a drunk gardener and janitor on October 27, 1911, before the attacker was overpowered by others.

Maurice Prindeville of Plymouth and Sheboygan operated a cheese factory in the town of Greenbush and hotels in St. Cloud, Dotyville, Plymouth and Kiel and was for a time a saloon keeper. Hoping for better weather and improved health, the well-off, nearly 60-year-old divorced man left for Hot Springs, Arkansas... only to be found lying dead on a private

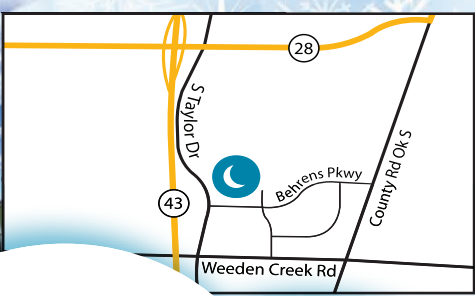

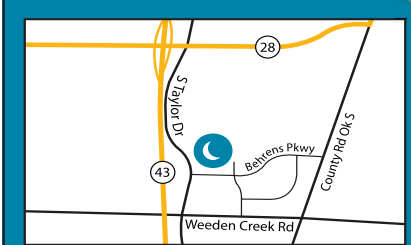

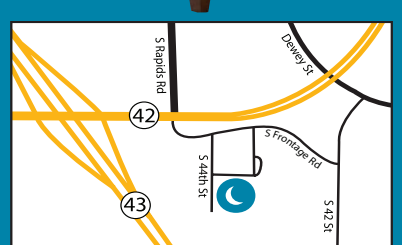

wharf in Bay St. Louis, Mississippi two months later, on January 21, 1923. The victim's wallet was empty and foul play was suspected, but a coroner's jury determined that death was due to natural causes. When Prindeville's corpse was shipped back to Plymouth, his family and local police thought otherwise when they found suspicious marks on his body and evidence of drugging, but Mississippi officials could not be swayed. Sheboygan County had its share of violence back at home,

too. In 1926 and 1927, a string of domestic murders gripped the City of Sheboygan. "Cowering behind a clump of bushes along the lakeshore, about a half mile south of the village of Centerville, a 12-inch butcher knife clutched in his left hand, Frank Peternel, who brutally murdered his wife on Monday, October 4, 1926, was captured after a four-hour manhunt," Reilly related. "His face, hands, and clothing were covered in blood. One of his hands was cut and bleeding. After capture the man was put in a strait jacket and taken to jail." Ingenious use of a spyglass by brothers Louis and Fred

Strattmann had led them to spot the fleeing Peternel in a field and alert police. Peternel confessed to slitting his wife Anna's throat after a quarrel and was sentenced to serve 14 to 25 years at the state penitentiary in Waupun. Their sons revealed that although their parents' life together had been good for time after they married 30 years before in Yugoslavia, fighting eventually became commonplace and Peternel had been violent for years. Just one year later, a double murder and suicide rocked the community.

Frank Doering had been chopping wood in the basement of his home not far from Sheboygan's Bethlehem Lutheran Church the morning of June 9, 1927, when his wife went down to retrieve some items and was horrified to find him sprawled on the floor, in a pool of blood and dead from a gunshot wound to the head, according to Reilly. No weapon was present and the only family member not accounted for was the youngest son, Walter Doering, who was known to have difficult relations with his father and trouble finding employment, since his right arm was paralyzed from a childhood bout of polio.

At about the same time, Walter appeared at the Bethlehem Lutheran parsonage and asked to see the Rev. William Wambsgans. The two went into the pastor's second-floor study. "Around noon, the pastor's

family had lunch without him as his guest still had not left," Reilly said. "A half hour later, the reverend's son needed some papers from his father's office. Going to the second floor, he listened at the closed door and heard nothing. Puzzled, the young man knocked, then opened the office door, and was confronted by a shocking scene."

On the floor was Walter Doering, dead of a gunshot wound to the head, with a 32-caliber revolver nearby. "At his desk, still seated in his chair, the Rev. Wambsgans was also found dead of a gunshot wound to the head. A blood-spattered bible lay open on the desk," Reilly added.

"Years later, questions remain: Why had no one in either home heard shots?," she asked. "What took place in the basement of the Doering home? And why had Walter Doering apparently shot the Rev. Wambsgans, and then himself?" It's more than enough fodder for a would-be spinoff of a popular TV series: "Unsolved Mysteries, Historical Edition." The Sheboygan County Historical Research Center is located at 518 Water Street in Sheboygan Falls and is open from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Tuesdays through Fridays. South's Stephen sticking it to cancer

"Yes, I can beat this."

Those are the words 17-year-old South senior Ryan Stephen has learned to live with since being diagnosed with stage four testicular cancer that later spread to his liver, kidneys, lungs and brain.

"They said it's pretty curable," Stephen said. "It's different in childhood than adults."

According to YaleMedicine.org, germ cell tumors (what Stephen has) are one of the most curable types of cancers with 5-year survival rates exceeding 90%.

"It's definitely hard because you can't do anything about it," Stephen said. "Like, it just kind of came into you, and there's nothing you can do. You've got to hope all this works."

This, as in the fifth of six rounds of chemotherapy Stephen started last week.

"It's definitely rough," Stephen said. "It doesn't make you feel the best, with a lot of side effects."

This, as in the prayers, well-wishes and support he's received since the diagnosis in mid-August.

"Obviously hearing the news was a huge shock to our basketball team and the school and the community," coach Jesse Shaw said. "I mean, it was shocking to hear that news. And then once you wrap your head around it, you realize that he's got a fight ahead of him. And he's going to have to obviously fight darn hard himself, and then draw upon the strength of others."

Stephen, who lost hair as well as 35 pounds, wasn't feeling well in mid-August.

He says he was really tired, and lacked motivation, energy and even an appetite.

So Stephen went to a clinic in Sheboygan three times in a span of about a week. On the third trip, staff told him they thought he has cancer based on test results.

"I didn't really know what to think, you know?" Stephen said. "I was just really surprised."

The clinic also sent him to Children's Hospital in Milwau-

kee later that night.

"I was just thinking, I didn't know what was ahead of me," Stephen said.

Once there, he was examined and told he needed surgery on a tumor the following day.

Four rounds of chemotherapy followed, but when they were recently completed, Stephen was told he needed two more rounds and probably another surgery.

So last Tuesday, he began his fifth round and goes for No. 6 in three weeks.

"They're thinking after these next two, it'll be gone," Stephen said. "That's what I'm thinking, too."

He's also thinking and hoping he's going to be able to play baseball this spring.

It would be his fourth season on varsity, and the pitcher/infielder has already been to UW-Stevens Point on a recruiting trip.

But Stephen, who hasn't attended school since the beginning of October, is missing out on his third season of varsity basketball.

As a result, Shaw reminds his players to keep things in perspective.

"As you go through the season, there's many ups and downs," he said. "It's almost a four-month season that's incredibly long, arduous. And there's highs and lows and different things. And we're trying to keep the perspective of when there is adversity, does that adversity really matter?"

"The little things like playing time and how many shots am I getting and little things that really don't matter at all when you've got a kid going through a battle. So it really puts things into perspective for players and coaches."

The Redwings are having a fundraiser for Stephen when they host Manitowoc Lincoln on Jan. 17 (only if he's able to attend).

There will be special shirts that can be purchased at the door

as well as other ways people can donate money, including a 50-50 raffle.

T-shirts were also created to raise money and were worn at the South-North football game.

There's been a brat fry.

Wristbands were also made.

And a GoFundMe has already wrapped up.

"It's definitely been rough, not being able to do normal activities like an everyday thing that all the other kids get to do," Stephen said. "Not being able to play sports is hard."

But Stephen is extremely thankful for family members like cousin Bryce TenPas, a senior at North who often visits him at home.

Stephen says Coach Shaw has been really helpful and was the first non-family member to visit him in the hospital.

"The entire community has been really supportive with t-shirts and bracelets and words of encouragement and kind gestures towards me and my family," Stephen said.

The Sheboygan North senior safety was a three-year starter and finished with over 100 tackles in high school.

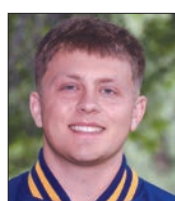
"This is probably a dream since I started playing football when I was younger," he said.

What in the wide world of sports is going on?

Let's get the straight. Juan Soto, as part of his record \$765 million, 15-year contract with the New York Mets, gets free use of a luxury suite and up to four premium tickets behind home plate for regular-season and postseason home games?

That's only the beginning. The All-Star outfielder will be provided personal security for him and his family at the team's expense for all spring training and regular-season games - home and away. New York also agreed to assist Soto's family for in-season travel arrangements, guaran-

teed he will have uniform No. 22 and included eight types of award bonuses.



Gingerbread takes the cake

this recipe for "Tender Gingerbread Cake" from "Butter, Flour, Sugar, Joy" (Sourcebooks) by Danielle Kartes.

- Tender Gingerbread Cake**
Yield: 1 cake
- 1 cup packed muscovado sugar (dark brown works great)
 - 1/2 cup plus 2 tablespoons butter, softened
 - 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
 - 2 eggs, room temperature
 - 1/4 cup plain full-fat Greek or plain yogurt
 - 1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
 - 1 teaspoon baking powder
 - 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
 - 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
 - 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves
 - 1/4 teaspoon ground ginger
 - 1/4 teaspoon apple pie spice

- 1 cup hot water
 - 3/4 cup molasses
- Garnishes**
- 1/2 cup confectioners' sugar
 - 1 cup pomegranate arils
- Preheat oven to 350 F. Line a 9-by-9-inch cake pan with parchment paper.
- Cream the sugar, butter, and vanilla on low speed, 3 minutes. Add the eggs one at a time and mix until just incorporated, then scrape down the sides of the bowl and gently fold the yogurt into the batter.
- In a separate bowl, whisk the flour, baking powder, salt, and spices together.
- In a third bowl, mix the hot water and molasses together.
- Now mix the dry ingredients

into the batter in 3 additions, alternating with the hot molasses water. Do not overmix.

Pour the batter into your lined pan and bake 25 to 30 minutes until the cake is well baked. Al-

low the gingerbread to cool, then dust with confectioners' sugar and pomegranate arils. This cake is also lovely with cream cheese icing! Serve and enjoy.

North takes 1st in stock market challenge

Three Sheboygan North students took first place in the second-annual Junior Achievement Stock Market Challenge.

Isahaq Abdullahi, Austin Hang, and Ezekiel Vang not only won \$150 apiece, they advanced to compete at nationals in Georgia.

"Oh, they were stoked. They were super happy," said North business teacher Michelle Daugherty.

And what about the rest of her accounting class students that participated?

"Well, they were bummed they didn't win, but they were happy that our school was first place," she said.

Twenty teams, from four schools, took part in the Challenge, held at UW-Green Bay

Sheboygan campus. According to its website, the JA Stock Market Challenge is a live simulation where students take what they learned in the classroom, through the JA Take Stock in your Future curriculum, and apply it to the real world.

JA Areas facilitate fast-paced competitions based on a fictional marketplace.

Students build their portfolio and spend '60 days' in a fictional stock market to see how their investments perform.

They will react to news events and have the ability to trade their stocks with floor traders.

"So they buy fictional stocks ahead of time," Daugherty said. "They get \$500,000 to buy as many stocks as they want, and then at the event there's live traders that walk around and allow the students to buy and sell the stocks that they have based on events that are happening in the world."

The three students had the highest net worth value from

their stocks to take first place. "Their secret was they waited until close to the end and then spent a ton of money in a certain stock one day, and flipped it the next day," Daugherty said. "They sold it the next day, so they jumped from like I think fifth place up to first place, and then they held first place for the last few rounds."

Classic holiday family film favorites

How to avoid holiday weight gains

Though the holiday season can be food-centric, it is possible to avoid gaining weight between late November and the start of a new year.

- 1. Eat protein in the morning.** A high-protein breakfast can keep blood sugar more stable throughout the day and help control appetite. This can curb snacking as well as over-indulgence later in the day during holiday meals.
- 2. Keep a consistent schedule.** Just because it's the holiday season doesn't mean schedules should go out the window. Stick to structured mealtimes and your usual exercise routine even amid all the celebrating.
- 3. Use smaller plates.** It's possible to fool yourself into thinking you ate more if you fill up a small plate rather than a large one. This can keep your portion sizes more within reason.
- 4. Curtail the cocktails.** Many people enjoy more alco-

holic drinks during the holiday season than they do at other times of the year. But alcoholic beverages can be high in calories, especially mixed drinks and traditional egg nog. If you choose to drink, Columbia University Irvington Medical Center suggests sticking to clear liquors with club soda in moderation, and limiting consumption of beer, wine and mixed drinks.

- 5. Load up on a protein-laden snack.** An hour before heading out for a holiday party or meal, enjoy a protein-rich shake or yogurt to allow for more self-control later on.
- 6. Eat strategically.** Fill up on vegetables, whole grains and other less calorie-dense foods. Go sparingly with the foods you know are historically less healthy, including fried offerings or cream-based dishes.
- 7. Manage stress effectively.** Although the holiday season is a festive time of year, it also can be stressful. Many people cope with stress by eating comfort foods, which can contribute to weight gain. Alleviate stress through exercise, meditation, talking with friends or a thera-

pist, or taking other measures that do not involve food or drinks.

8. Take the focus off food. Whenever possible, build holiday-related activities around something other than food. For example, replace family baking sessions with some homemade wreath-making.

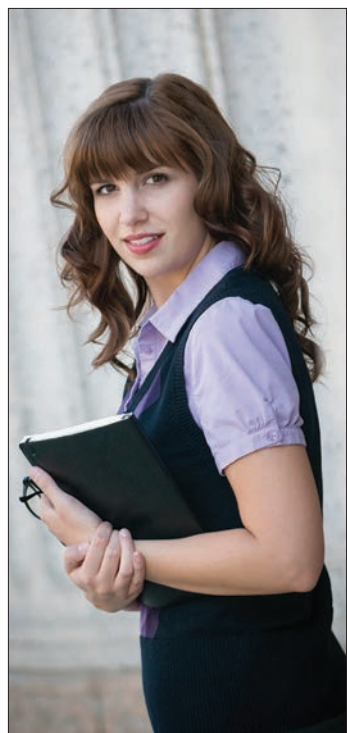

Be mindful of pets during the holiday season

Tips to simplify holiday cooking

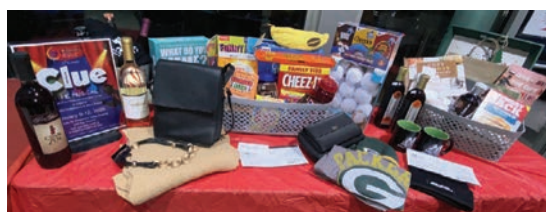
