Christmas doll set school gift shop in motion

Perhaps you were fortunate enough to receive a gift 'bought' at the Longfellow Holiday Shop.

Children from the elementary school have been 'shopping' there for years, all because a student left a gift for Amy Verhagen in 2012.

"She left it for me on my desk," the Longfellow dean of students said. "She was homeless and kind of having a hard time with the holidays, but she gave me a doll that she had wrapped up for Christmas. And it got me thinking about teaching our students - because we have a lot of community organizations that will reach out and give us gifts for students - the opportunity to feel the joy of giving, and to see how that makes people feel."

A year later, Longfellow's Holiday Shop made its debut at the school thanks to contributions from school staff members.

"Anytime I have some kind of idea that I feel will help our team grow, the staff always comes together and does whatever they can," Verhagen said. "I presented the idea to the staff and someone wrote a grant to

get donations from Joann Fabric. And then it was actually cool, because I just reached out to my family and friends, teachers also reached out to their families and got a bunch of donations. And then everyone was on board for whatever they could do."

Verhagen's goal was to have each student pick two gifts for family members from the Holiday Shop, which was held in a small music room the first year.

A custodian then took it upon himself to redo a locker room to increase the size of the store.

"So he took out all the lockers, all the benches, on his own time," Verhagen said. "And that's where now I have like an actual shop that the kids can select a gift from the shelf, and just get that real feel about shopping and picking things out for others."

Every year, some of the around 300 students shopping can be heard saying 'I can't wait to give this to my mom,' or 'this is going to make my grandma so happy.'

The kids are able to buy presents because of people like Jill Posewitz. She's often a substitute teacher at Longfellow,

and years ago happened to be filling in on one of the days the Holiday Shop was open.

Posewitz asked Verhagen what it was all about, and ever since, she and her Bethany Church members donate a significant amount.

And a retired teacher who volunteers at Longfellow, Connie Beiersdorf, also reached out to her Zion Church and donated

\$250.

Students shopped this year from Dec. 16-19, and walked through a candy cane lane to get there. The Shop is filled with lights and holiday music, and a fifth-grade leadership group helps the younger students figure out what to get.

"I'm really big on students helping students," Verhagen said. "So the kids come with a

little shopping list, and it's pretty fun to see the fifth-graders say, 'oh, this would be a good gift for your mom,' or, 'you know, this would be great for your aunt.' So that's fun, and then I think the coolest part, too, is then they bring it to a wrapping station so they really have beautifully wrapped gifts to bring home."

And Santa doesn't even have to worry if any of the students are being naughty during their time outside of the classroom.

"They're just super well behaved; no one needs any behavior reminders," Verhagen said. "They all just come up, give hugs to the teachers or the volunteers that are wrapping. When you have a group of 50 students coming in and shopping, and you don't have to remind them to say thank you ... It's just, the atmosphere is very magical. Like, the teachers being there with a little extra bounce, and the volunteers, you can see it in their bodies, which are just light and happy. And there's just that feeling of this is what the holidays are about. We're all just in that true spirit of the holidays."

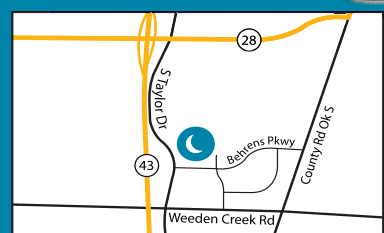

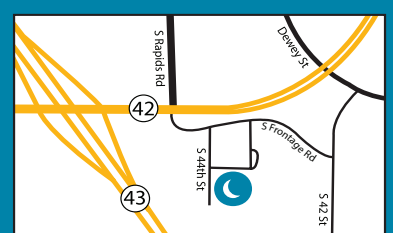

Three fatalities in auto crash

On Saturday Dec. 21, at 11:20 a.m. the Sheboygan County Emergency Communications Center received a 911 call reporting a two-vehicle accident on Lower Falls Rd., Kohler at I43.

A preliminary investigation indicates a westbound vehicle operated by a 35-year-old male from Sheboygan Falls left the roadway to the north, overcorrected before crossing into the path of an eastbound vehicle operated by a 77-year-old male with a 77-year-old passenger from the City of Sheboygan.

As a result of the accident the two occupants of the eastbound vehicle were pronounced deceased at the scene. The single occupant of the westbound vehicle died while en route to the hospital.

The victims were identified by the Kohler Police Department as Steven Larson and Lynda Larson of Sheboygan and Curtis Britton of Sheboygan Falls. Speed does appear to be a factor in the westbound vehicle leaving the roadway.

This crash is still under investigation.

Town of Sheboygan Fire, Sheboygan County Sheriff's Office, Sheboygan Falls Police Department, Orange Cross Ambulance, Wisconsin State Patrol, and Sheboygan County Highway Department assisted the Kohler Police Department and Kohler Fire Department in this incident.

\$583,746 lottery ticket sold in Sheboygan

A Wisconsin Lottery player made history on Tuesday Dec. 24 after winning the largest Fast Play Progressive Jackpot since the game's debut on April 23, 2023.

The lucky player won 100% of the \$583,746 Progressive Jackpot by purchasing a winning \$10 "50 Times The Money" ticket at Jake's Wines and Liquor on 2019 S. Business Dr. in Sheboygan, according to a Wisconsin Lottery news release.

The winning jackpot eclipsed the previous Fast Play jackpot record of \$403,497, won from a ticket sold by the Bread and Butter Shop in Nekoosa in 2023.

The Wisconsin Lottery gives back 93 percent of its revenue to winners, retailers, and Wisconsin homeowners. Since 1988, the Wisconsin Lottery has generated more than \$19.1 billion in total revenue, with over \$10.8 billion in prizes paid. It has generated more than \$5.7 billion in funding for property tax credits to eligible Wisconsin homeowners.

Sway's now open, inheriting Klemme's traditions

Sway's Bar and Event Center has been open for about a month, and its kitchen will make its debut Thursday in Howards Grove.

The menu will feature the original recipe for the broasted chicken Klemme's Wagon Wheel sold until closing in early 2021 - after 48 years in business.

"We heard many stories about how it was to die for," said Josue Valenzuela, who helps his family run the place in Howards Grove. "And we're excited to bring that back again. Definitely keep on the lookout for other special dishes. We're excited to get things rolling again with the kitchen."

Those hoping to dine in on opening weekend will need to make a reservation by calling (920) 828-0015 or send Sway's a message on Facebook.

Sway's, which sells appetizers for now, named Fazli Ademi as its executive chef last week.

"I think our next big step is getting the kitchen rolling, ob-

viously making sure everything is correct," Valenzuela said. "We're excited to see more people come through. And people can call or email us for reservations because we're starting to take those as well."

The Valenzuela family bought the building in late June and named it Sway's because that is what people call Josue (pronounced ho-sway).

Valenzuela's father, Manny, is from Chihuahua, Mexico, where he ran a restaurant back in the day.

He vacationed and visited friends in New Holstein, and enjoyed the area so much, he moved there 24 years ago.

Manny had worked on the same Wisconsin dairy farm ever since, but sold his part of the ownership when he decided to purchase Klemme's Wagon Wheel.

"The thing is, every person I told, has told me they know the place," he said. "People in Green Bay, Milwaukee. And that was crazy because when I told people, they're like, 'no, no, I know where it is. You don't need to give me the address.'"

Just in case, it's located at 120 South Wisconsin Drive.

And fans of the former 'Wheel,' as it was known, reached out immediately when they heard Sway's was taking its place.

"They found out we were looking into buying it, and many people reached out saying how much history that place held, all the tradition, and all the folks that it once gathered," Josue said. "And once we opened it up, people kept supporting us, showed a lot of love, saying how we wanted to keep some of the tradition the same, like some of the light beams, some of the pictures are all still the same. We just touched it up. It's the original bar from the original owners."

"Obviously we wanted to add a little, give it a little bit of an upgrade, but also keep some of the things the same. We're surprised how much the community reached out to us saying how happy they were and were really excited to see this place back alive."

Sway's is open Thursdays and Fridays at 3 p.m., and Saturday and Sunday at 11 a.m.

What in the wide world of sports?

It has come to this: former Green Bay quarterback Aaron Rodgers admits he could be released by the New York Jets after this season.

Rodgers, talking on 'The Pat McAfee Show,' says he'll take some time in the coming weeks to figure out his plans for a 21st season in the National Football League.

"I think there's a world where they just say, 'Hey, thank you, we're going to go in another direction,'" Rodgers said. "That's a possibility."

New York will miss the playoffs for the 14th straight year, the longest active drought in the league.

Rodgers has said his first

preference if he decides to continue playing would be to do so with the Jets, and he reiterated Monday he'd be willing to take a pay cut and mentor a young quarterback if the team drafts one.

But it's unclear if owner Woody Johnson shares the sentiment of wanting Rodgers back.

In a story published last week by The Athletic, anonymous sources described a level of dysfunction within the franchise.

It included allegations that Johnson is influenced by his teenage sons Brick and Jack.

"Being released would be a first," Rodgers said. "Being re-

Football coaches voice their playoff opinion

The WFCAs announced the results of a survey in the state regarding the proposed Wisconsin Football Playoff Matrix.

A total of 400 head coaches responded out of roughly 425 programs in the state, with responses divided roughly equal-

ly across the seven divisions of 11-player football as well as 8-player football.

The results showed 87.5%, or 350 total respondents, supported the proposed changes, while just 12.5% (50) preferred maintaining the status quo for playoff qualification, grouping, and seeding.

The WFCAs have indicated



that given the overwhelming support amongst its members, they will be recommending that

the WIAA Football Coaches Advisory introduce the plan at its upcoming Jan. 7th meeting.

From there, it would continue through the WIAA committee process, with a potential approval vote by the WIAA Board of Control coming up on Feb. 5th.

The Wisconsin Football Playoff Matrix was introduced

by the WFCAs in recent weeks, developed by Edgewood head coach Jesse Norris and assistant Andy LaVoy.

The plan would utilize a points-based system to change how playoff qualification is determined, how teams are grouped within their divisions, and how teams are seeded within their groupings.

Lakeland University to offer women's flag football next year

Lakeland University will add women's flag football as a sport beginning with the 2025-26 academic year.

Director of Athletics Dan Artamenko said recruiting and hiring a coach will begin immediately.

"Women's flag football is one of the fastest growing sports in college athletics, especially in the Midwest," he said. "Lakeland has a proud tradition of success in women's athletics and I'm confident that our flag football program will become the latest way that Muskies make memories on and off the field."

Women's flag football, which will be an Olympic sport in Los Angeles in 2028, is growing rapidly at the NCAA level with 400-plus schools expressing interest in starting programs over the last two months.

There are 12 confirmed varsity programs for this academic year with multiple schools adding a program weekly.

At the high school level, there are more than 22,000

girls playing flag football according to the National Federation of State High School Association and nine sanctioned championship states for high school girls flag football, with over 20 states in emerging stages.

In Wisconsin, more than 60 high schools have expressed their interest in girl's flag football.

"We were proud to be the first in the state to launch women's wrestling and that spirit of innovation, a Lakeland hallmark, continues with the addition of women's flag football," said Lakeland President Beth Borgen. "We have a great facility in Taylor Field and numerous academic

programs that make Lakeland an attractive place for future Muskies."

Women's collegiate flag football, which spans from February to May, is a 7-on-7 competition played in four 12-minute quarters on a football field 40 yards wide by 80 yards long.

Each team moves offensively by running or passing a football, while the defense tries to "tackle" by pulling flags on the ball carrier's belt.

Teams play around 8 or 9 games with a total roster size of 20-25 athletes.

Lighthouse Recovery Community Center - Sheboygan is a hidden gem in Sheboygan County. Providing important recovery services and support. LRCC has been in the community since December 2021

as a recovery community center (RCC). At that time the only other RCC was leaving the area, when Lighthouse Recovery Community Center, originally founded in Manitowoc County in 2018, was extended an invitation to expand services to Sheboygan County. The opportunity fit the mission and vision of LRCC and felt like an important opportunity to make sure there wasn't a gap in this valuable support for those

seeking recovery support in the Sheboygan County area. Since that time LRCC - Sheboygan has had a recovery community center offering peer support and coaching services, along with weekday hours at the recovery center where individuals can come and find a safe, supportive, social place to spend time, take part in fun pro-social activities and begin connections/friendships. Recovery meetings are hosted at the center 7 days

a week and crisis services, by certified recovery specialists, are available 24/7.

One of the future goals is to also bring supportive recovery housing to Sheboygan County. LRCC is currently on the lookout for available space and potential partnering individuals, businesses, or organizations to help make this a reality. In Manitowoc, there are currently 4 WASH (Wisconsin Association of Sober Housing) residences

under the Lighthouse umbrella. These are available to Sheboygan County residents, but we know the importance of this type of service being provided right in someone's hometown as they begin the recovery journey.

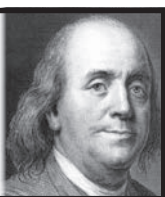

Biscotti are a dunkable delicacy

Cookies are a treat any time of the day, and many find biscotti particularly appealing. These crunchy cookies are equally at home with a morning cup of coffee as they are with an evening mug of hot cocoa.

Though they might seem complicated, biscotti generally are easy to make. Try this recipe for "Semolina and Almond Biscotti" from "Butter, Flour, Sugar, Joy" (Sourcebooks) by Danielle Kartes.

Semolina and Almond Biscotti

Yields 12 to 16 cookies

1 cup sugar

1/2 cup melted butter
3 eggs
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 pinch salt
2 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
1 cup sliced almonds
1/2 cup semolina flour
1 teaspoon baking powder
Optional: 10 ounces dark chocolate to melt for dipping

Preheat oven to 325 F. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.

In a stand mixer, cream the sugar, butter and eggs until light and creamy, about 2 to 3 minutes.

Add the vanilla and salt. Mix to incorporate.

Add the all-purpose flour, almonds, semolina flour, and baking powder. Mix until well combined, but don't overmix.

Turn the dough out onto the prepared baking sheet. Pat gently to form one long loaf of dough roughly 14 to 16 inches long and 5 to 6 inches wide. Bake 30 minutes.

Remove the loaf from the oven and allow to cool 5 to 6 minutes before using a long knife to cut the loaf gently into 12 to 16 cookies.

Lay each cookie on its side and bake another 20 minutes, flipping the cookies midway through.

Cool completely to achieve that signature crunch. The centers will be a bit soft if eaten warm.

These are perfect for dunking in coffee, tea or hot chocolate.

Optional: Melt the chocolate in the microwave in 30-second bursts and gently dip half of each biscotti into it lengthwise. Flip the biscotti chocolate-side-up onto a sheet tray and allow the chocolate to set.

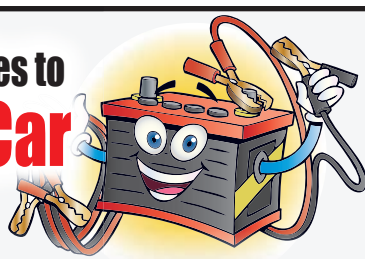

Now it's time for a WALK on the wild side

IN MY VIEW

The mission statement of the Friends of the Broughton Sheboygan Marsh, formed in 2005, is "to promote the increased use and appreciation of the unique beauty of the Broughton Sheboygan County Marsh through education and recreation."

With that being said the Friends have now started a new adventure which is a boardwalk out into the marsh. More info will be coming as time goes along. Again this will be built with public dollars.

Their first project was the construction of Wisconsin's tallest wooden observation tower, which opened fifteen years ago and allows visitors to have a birds-eye view of the marsh and surrounding terrain. Hoping to commence construction in the spring, the Friends appreciated the generosity of the donors who have contributed to make this happen. They then needed to become a non-profit 501(c)(3) which they did and that helped with the funding. Next came Reed Schmitt from Jos. Schmitt Construction whose daughter Christine attended a two day field trip at the marsh and told her father what a great place this was and between Reed and his brother Steve offered to build the tower and that's how it got started.

Have you climbed this lately, the tallest wooden tower

in the state of Wisconsin, 80 ft. It is located at the Sheboygan County Marsh Park.

This Christmas the tower will be opened to the public for 15 years already. Where has the time gone? We started that project back in 2005 and in 2009 it was completed to be open to the public on Christmas.

This tower gives you the opportunity to view the Sheboygan marsh from 80 ft high. It has 4 landings and you can sit on the second and top landings and just relax or see the view.

If you are not able to climb 144 easy steps you can see the view from inside the restaurant with a camera and joy stick to move it around.

The Friends of the Sheboygan Broughton Marsh, Inc collected the funds from private donors as well as local companies to share with everyone. What you see from the top is a beautiful view of the marsh and animals that inhabit the area.

Over the past 15 years we have had an engagement, wedding, anniversaries and funerals held at the tower. Our contractor Jos. Schmitt & Sons did an excellent job on this project.

Next the Friends started working to further enhance the park with the creation of a multi-purpose/educational center and meeting facility that will house Camp Y-Koda's environmental programs, field trips from schools throughout the area and other groups who appreciate conservation efforts and wildlife at the marsh.

Our next project was the Kohler Center for Marsh Education also located on the south end of the park. This center is open to the public for events such as showers, birthday parties, and other celebrations which if you reach out to the Sheboygan County Planning Dept. 920-459-3060 they will gladly help you make your reservation. This beautiful building was also built by Jos. Schmitt Construction. The main focus is for educating the youth from the surrounding schools on their two day field trips to the marsh. The center attraction has a 115 year old tree from the marsh which holds up the Atrium. This building also houses the latest in showers and a safe space from storms for the campers. All plumbing was donated by Kohler Company.

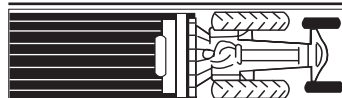
