Golf discs salvaged from quarry

Brandon Ray Watson is one of many who have misplayed golf discs into the Sheboygan Quarry.

So the founder and president of Sheboygan Eagles Disc Golf Club turned to Ed Bieber - also known as Ed the Diver - to find as many as he could in early May.

"I follow Ed on his social media platforms," said Watson, who graduated from South High School in 2003. "I enjoy watching the videos, the dives, the waterways and what he cleans up and what he finds."

"I know he had done some disc golf recoveries on courses in Green Bay and other areas. So, I decided to just shoot him a message and say, 'hey, it'd be cool, I think, to see what the quarry looks like beneath the water. And it would be awe-

some to get some of the discs back for our local disc golf community."

Bieber, who was born in Marinette and began his diving recovery business eight years ago, got 251 discs out of the quarry.

"I can't say I expected to find that many," Watson said. "And knowing that he just ran out of air in the tanks and energy to be able to keep going but could see several more out there, led me to reach out to one of our local firefighters who's going to use it for search and rescue practice and continue to support recovering disks for us."

Bieber says he went through two air tanks and was under water for an hour.

He'd fill up a mesh bag with the discs, bring it onshore, and dive back in for more.

"Some of his followers even showed up and wanted to see," Watson said. "We got to watch

and kind of support him collecting what he was able to find."

Since most discs cost around \$14, golfers are eager to get them back. But cost isn't the only reason.

"I think a lot of the discs that people lose have more sentimental than actual physical value," Watson said. "But several of the discs that we found, people had hole-in-ones or just more sentimental stuff that people are hoping to get back. Usually after you've thrown a disc for a significant amount of time, you develop that trust with it and it becomes one of your go-to for certain shots."

"So when you lose it, it's like trying to start all over and replace your lucky baseball glove or whatever it is that you use sports-wise. But you just love it for whatever reason."

Watson says probably 35 discs have already been claimed by its owner.

Since Sheboygan Eagles DGC is hosting its annual Pickle Open is June 28-29, Watson will have the remainder of the discs on hand for people to claim.

"It's for anybody that wants to come skim through them," he said. "Everybody that had a name, a number, or some identifier has been texted, called, messaged. Not everybody's gotten around to finding a time

to swing by, but we're going to try to make sure everybody gets that chance.

"And then after the Pickle Open, toward the end of the season, we'll probably end up just

selling off the remaining discs and use that as a fundraiser for the club to help with some of the course projects and different improvements that we've been working on."



A Look Back - Civil War veterans, June, 1925

From June 15 to 17, 1925, Sheboygan hosted a huge Wisconsin Department of the Grand Army of the Republic encampment drawing delegates from this state and beyond and featuring a highly emotional mayoral address and many other speeches, business meetings, receptions, ceremonies, banquets, dances, performances, campfire programs and a spectacular parade in honor of Civil War veterans then ranging in age from their 70s to their 90s. In the photo above, a group of these distinguished veterans pose in front of Fountain Park's Civil War monument on the second day of massive and multi-faceted affair.

"With hearts deeply touched and eyes filled with tears of mingled happiness and sadness, Sheboygan people turned out in the thousands at 9:30 AM today to cheer the war veterans as they marched up 8th Street to the reviewing stand in Fountain Park from where they viewed the longest parade ever held at a Wisconsin State G.A.R. encampment," gushed a Sheboygan Press article on June 17, 1925, the last day of the convention. "To witness the group of nearly 250 G.A.R. veterans marching is one of the rarest privileges of the present day... The grand parade, a great personification of patriotism marking the climax to the 59th annual encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic, Wisconsin department, was a pan-

orama of bright colors in which the various military, patriotic and civic organizations, together with schoolchildren and townspeople, vied with each other in paying tribute to the Saviors of the Union."

It was the first time since 1901 that such a statewide encampment had been based in Sheboygan and the event dominated local news coverage for days. Delegates from at least seven organizations, including not only the G.A.R. but also the Iron Brigade, the Women's Relief Corps, the Sons of Veterans, the Daughters of Veterans and the Ladies of the G.A.R., were headquartered at the Foeste and Grand Hotels and held their events in the high school auditorium, local churches and halls and other venues around the city.

Federal funding withdrawn from Kohler Arts Center

Already-pledged federal funding from the National Endowment for the Arts for John Michael Kohler Arts Center has been withdrawn, a May 28 email message from JMKAC Executive Director Amy Horst said.

"In 2025, funding that had already been pledged by the NEA to host acclaimed artist and musician Lonnie Holley for a residency at JMKAC is now being withdrawn. We were informed that due to a shift in agency priorities set by the current administration, our work is no longer considered a match for the NEA, despite years of continuous support."

The NEA has provided over \$1 million in funding to JMKAC over 20 years, according to the letter.

The message says JMKAC has filed an appeal, and will continue to honor its commitment to the affected artist.

The letter encourages supporters to:

"Contact the offices of U.S. Representative Glenn Grothman and U.S. Senators Tammy Baldwin and Ron Johnson to express your opposition to NEA funding cuts.

"Share stories and examples of how the NEA supports local arts initiatives and benefits Sheboygan with your family, friends, and neighbors.

"Engage with JMKAC about volunteering and other ways to support our work."

Firefighters modernize ambulance service

The Sheboygan Fire Department is proud to announce the addition of two new state-of-the-art ambulances to its fleet, significantly enhancing safety for both patients and emergency providers.

The department extends its gratitude to the Common Council and the Sheboygan community for their unwavering support of public safety, which made these critical upgrades possible.

This month, the department placed two new ambulances into service as part of its ongoing effort to replace its aging fleet, all of which had been in service for over 16 years.

Due to initial delays in the building process, out of the departments control, the ambulances arrived closer together than anticipated.

The first ambulance, MED 1853, was placed into service on May 10th at Fire Station 3. This 2024 AEV ambulance, ordered in 2022 through American Response Vehicles, is a custom-built unit designed specifically for the Sheboygan Fire Department.

Notably, MED 1853 is the department's first door-forward ambulance, featuring a reconfigured entry to the patient compartment that maximizes space for patient care, improving provider efficiency during emergencies while

they care for patients.

The second ambulance, MED 1852, was placed into service on May 20th at Fire Station 2. This Demers ambulance, ordered in 2024 through Pomasl Fire Equipment, Inc., complements the department's modernization efforts and mirrors the new MED 1851 which responds out of Fire Station 1.

Both ambulances are equipped with advanced safety features to prioritize patient care and provider well-being. Key enhancements include:

- 5-point harnesses for secure patient and provider restraint during transport.

- FERNO Power load patient cots and stair chairs, which reduce the physical strain on providers by automating lifting and maneuvering, enhancing efficiency and

reducing the risk of injury.

- Custom FERNO trax systems, designed to securely fasten equipment, minimizing risks in high-pressure emergency situations.

These advancements reflect the department's commitment to leveraging innovative technology to deliver superior emergency medical services while safeguarding the health and safety of its providers.

As part of the fleet transition, the former MED 1853 will be sold, while the former MED 1852 will be retained as a spare unit at Fire Station 5, ensuring operational readiness across the department.

The Sheboygan Fire Department remains dedicated to the community by being a leader in fire, rescue, and emergency medical services.

Conference champs are everywhere

■ Three come in track and field

Christian senior Brock Zylstra became the first track and field athlete at the school to win a conference championship when he claimed the Big East title in the high jump with a measure of 6-0. Not bad for someone who never participated in the sport until joining the Eagles nearly a quarter of the way into this season.

“One day at practice, I casually asked if he wanted to give high jump a try,” coach Lauren Delray said. “He wasn’t sure he’d be any good, but I told him I had a feeling he’d be great at it. As it turns out, he’s been a natural since day one.

“In just a short time, he not only learned how to high jump ... it has been incredible and fun to watch him grow and compete with such instinct and determination despite being so new to the sport.”

Two other area athletes were also champs.

North senior Vince Nienhuis placed first in the 110 hurdles in 14.66 (he was fourth a year ago), third in the 300 hurdles in 41.60 (second last season) and fifth in the 100 in 11.12 at the Fox River

Classic Meet.

South junior David Venegas won the 400 in 49.66.

“He has really come into his own this year and loves the 400,” coach Kevin Herber said. “He is diligent in his preparation for the grueling race.”

Other North results

Golden Raiders' senior Destiny Duesterbeck finished runner-up in the shot put with a 36-9 (fourth last year).

Senior Ryan Lang was third

in the 800 in 1:59.65 (first in 2024) and fifth in the 400 in 51.42 (fourth in '24).

Third also went to sophomore Wesnaytha Benish in the high jump at 4-10.

Senior Cynthia Martinez placed fourth in the discus in 102-3.

Abby Schneider, a sophomore, finished fourth as well in the high jump at 4-10.

Junior Carter Gabrielse ended fifth in the 200 in 22.91 and sixth in the 100 in 11.22.



Fifth also went to senior Dorothy Quasius in the triple jump in 32-6.75.

Additional South stats

Junior Jayden Wesaw came in second in the long jump at 20-9.25 (third last season).

Second also went to sophomore Olivia Knowles in the 100 in 12.56, and she was third in the 200 in 26.15.

Senior Peyton Trimberger ended fifth in the 300 hurdles in 41.96.

Other Eagles results

Senior Greta Leikip placed fourth in the long jump (15-0) and junior Cameron Ferraino ended fifth in the triple jump (40-7.5; seventh last year).

Lutheran stats

The Crusaders' top finish at the BEC meet was fifth, thanks to the 3,200 relay of freshman Eddy Giebler, senior Ethan Winter, sophomore Titus Gottschalk and junior James Duplechain (8:57.77).

■ North wins tennis, first time since 2008

Mike Vorpahl returned as tennis coach at North this season, and the boys rewarded him with the program's first conference championship since 2008.

The Golden Raiders went 9-0 in Fox River Classic play and Green Bay Notre Dame was 8-1.

“It took a total team effort to win the conference,” Vorpahl said. “De Pere is solid and Notre Dame has been state-ranked all season, so it is a very gratifying accomplishment.”

Fourth athletes won every FRCC match this year as well: the No. 2 doubles team of sophomore Aiden DeRuyter/senior Austin Kohn, and the No. 3 team of sophomore Frankie Quasius/junior Colby Smith.

Rounding out the roster were three seniors (Oliver Quintero, Tyler Konrad, Alex DiStefano) and three juniors (Elijah Lee, Will Rollins, Sawyer Brault).





Families celebrate Dad in unique ways on Father's Day. Gifts are customary, but so is a delicious meal Dad will love. Many dads will appreciate a meal that goes above and beyond the ordinary, preferably something that is hearty and delicious. These "Pecan-Stuffed Pork Chops" from "Jon Bonnell's Texas Favorites" (Gibbs Smith) are a great dish to serve family style when everyone gathers around the table for Father's Day.

Make a Father's Day meal Dad can savor

Pecan-Stuffed Pork Chops Serves 7-8

- 1 large rack of pork chops, bones in
- 4 tablespoons butter
- 1/2 yellow onion, chopped
- 2 ribs celery, chopped
- 5 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 1/2 cups chicken stock
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 2 cups panko bread crumbs
- 2 cups
- 2 cups roasted pecans, chopped
- More kosher salt and pepper, to taste

Clean the rack of pork well and cut in between the bones to get thick individual pork chops. Cut a large slit down the back side of each chop and insert the tip of a knife 2 to 3 inches inside the chop to create a pocket for the stuffing. Do not poke completely through the pork or the stuffing will not stay in.

In a large saucepan, melt the butter and sauté the onion, celery and garlic until the onion has slightly softened. Add the chicken stock, salt and cayenne and bring to a light simmer.

Pour the contents into a mixing bowl and add the panko bread crumbs and pecans. Mix together and let cool to room temperature. Stuff as much of the mixture into each pork chop as will fit (overstuffing is okay, too). Sprinkle both sides of each chop with salt and pepper to taste, then roast in a preheated 400 F oven for 12 minutes. Turn the chops over once and roast an additional 15 minutes. Check for doneness with a meat thermometer. Cook to medium, or 135 to 140 F.



The Old Red Hen

Hello friends,

This week's column is basically about life, hobby farming, being the president of two youth organizations, and my favorite chicken ever. Over the last nine days I have slept in my truck two nights, had four scheduled events for KAMO and NOAC, welcomed home Kai Chiaro for the summer (Michelle's daughter who will be staying here this summer as she has her old job back at a local restaurant/ice cream shop), ran my bear baits, had the heartbreak of finding out that my daughter Selina cannot come home for vacation, as she had transmission problems 2 hours after leaving Missoula, gardened as much as I could and prepared the beach that NOAC built for a summer of fun.

I have a flock of 16 laying hens and one rooster. The hens are 1, 3 and 7 years old, only one is 7. From October to April they are free roaming, I cannot let them be free during the garden season as they will tear up my gardens and also destroy my lawn. In the world of chickens, every day, generally in the late afternoon, the rooster breeds each hen.

This winter I noticed the 7-year-old hen was staying in the hen house, keeping her head in the corner all the time and getting pecked apart by the other hens. Over a period of time, I realized the cause.

The Old Red Hen was not letting the rooster have his way anymore. In January she started sleeping by my front door instead of the safety of the hen house, I made a nest for her, gave her very nice treats and

every late afternoon she would come wobbling over to her nest, I would hold and pet her and she would rest easy.

By mid-February I had enough of watching the rooster punish her enough for not allowing him to have his way. I figured 15 hens was enough. Instead of April, I penned them up then.

The Old Red Hen went from a skeleton that could hardly walk to a very heavy chicken that had the run/waddle of the property. She is like clockwork, about sunset she hits her nest and sunrise she is up and at them. I hold her like a kitten, and she loves me.

When the Old Red Hen was 6 months old, Kai's mom, Michelle and I were about as happy as a couple could be, Kai was in 7th grade and Selina was a senior in high school,

probably the happiest year of my life. Now Selina is a biologist in Missoula, Kai is a "Razorback" down in Alabama going to school for nursing, like her mom, and Michelle is in heaven.

Three years ago, the Old Red Hen was four, pretty close to the end of her laying life but the Queen of her flock and one by one her sisters passed away. Michelle and I had just purchased a new Polaris quad atv so that we would not be breaking the law by riding on my 2013 which is not a Quad. Kai was working at the ice cream shop "on highway 21" and as always, Michelle and I were running bear baits and always had our Tuesday night "date night."

On June 15th, 2022, Michelle passed away unexpectedly

from sepsis. Many lives were at least temporarily shattered. Michelle loved the chickens, and I am betting The Old Red Hen misses her.

The following March our swimming pool which Michelle also loved, disintegrated, I had had a pool for 22 years. Within a day I came up with the idea of building a pond. The pond has been the most physical and time-consuming project of my life. I named it Lake Matilda and the Old Red Hen enjoys drinking out of it.

That fall I harvested a large black bear at our favorite bear bait and a 6x6 bull elk on a solo hunt in Montana. No matter

how bad the bugs were, how cold it was or how much she got beat up "Matilda" always demanded to participate and was my partner in every adventure possible.

This was also the time that Necedah's school administrator who is my very close friend Tanya Kotlowski talked me in to starting an outdoor club for Necedah what would become NOAC. We have built an ice skating rink with lights, a beach with picnic area and this week we finished a first rate disk golf course, at each of these locations we hold events that are a lot of fun.

The Old Red Hen is as happy as she could be, Selina is coming home in three weeks, Kai is making money to exist during the school year, bluegill are about to spawn in the Lake Matilda and I'm thinking the perch already did. I have a bear tag and an elk tag, and my old saying is true as ever and that is, "no matter how rough things get, the sun always comes up in the morning."



Farmers are busy in their fields and with newborn animals, and signs of summer are popping up everywhere around Wisconsin, which means that soon it will be time to celebrate June Dairy Month! Let's learn a little about how our state came to be known as America's Dairyland.

Around the time Wisconsin became a state in 1848, it was known as America's breadbasket, with one sixth of the nation's wheat being harvested here. According to the Wisconsin Historical Society (WHS), settlers in Wisconsin chose wheat because it did not require much money, was relatively easy to grow, and could be harvested twice a year.

However, continuous planting of that single crop depleted the soil, and in the 1860s, damage caused by chinch bugs further decimated the wheat yield. Needing to change course, Wisconsin's farmers started adding dairy cows to their business approach and finding success. Our climate was ideal for dairy cattle and the soil was better suited for feed crops.

Well before the 1960s, some Wisconsinites were making cheese. According to WHS, Charles Rockwell of Koshkonong was one of the earliest in 1837, and Anne Pickett established a cheese factory in Lake Mills in 1841, using milk from

neighbors' cows. However, before Wisconsin's dairy boom, New York was the leading dairy state. Then many New Yorkers moved here, bringing knowledge and skills for dairying on a commercial scale. At this time, Wisconsin dairies primarily produced cheese because it kept longer than the butter that was being made in other dairy-producing states.

Seeing a fast-growing opportunity for farmers, the University of Wisconsin began researching ways to support the dairy industry. William A. Henry, the UW's first professor of agriculture, used the

school's farm to study the use of round silos to feed cattle during winter, and Professor Stephen Babcock developed the first test for butterfat content in milk. The university also started a "short course" to educate farmers about the dairy industry.

William Dempster Hoard, the 16th Governor of Wisconsin, was also instrumental to the success of Wisconsin dairy farming. Hoard started the Wisconsin Dairyman's Association in Watertown in 1872 to provide marketing for the industry along with education in new dairying methods through its publications and meetings.

Hoard's Dairyman was established in 1885 and quickly became the nation's leading dairy magazine.

By 1899, more than 90% of Wisconsin farms raised dairy cows. By 1915, Wisconsin had become the leading dairy state in the nation, producing more butter and cheese than any other state.

Fast forward more than 100 years and Wisconsin still maintains the title of America's Dairyland. Today, our state is home to nearly a quarter of the nation's dairy farms, 99% of which are family-owned. Our farm families understand the




